

Dudapest, October 10-A consider able drop in prices and a notable increase of goods offered for sale are the first results of the Hungarian Profiteering Act, just become law. Flogging is one of the penalties prescribed for violation of the Act which is one of the most drastic pieces of legislation of its kind in the world.

Profiteering, as defined under the Act, consists, among other things, in buying and selling above maximum price; sharing more profits than customary; offering lower wages to a man than those laid down; speculation in foodstuffs and trying to make a "cor-
