## THE FARMER CANDIDATE WON IN EAST ELGIN

Captured the Constituency by Nearly Two Hundred Majority in a Three-Cornered Fight—The Handwriting on the Wall for the Meighen Government—Yale, B. C., Returns the Government Candidate.

Toronto, Nov. 22—In the by-election held in the constituency of East Elgin in south western Ontario today. S. S. McDermid, nominee of the United Farmers' party received 3,063 votes as against 2,855 for J. L. Stansell, Conservative and 1,929 for W. G. Charlton, Liberal. At the general election of 1917 the constituency returned David Marshall, Conservative, and has usually elected a Conservative since 1892.

Has Been a Conservative Stronghold. East Elgin in thirteen federal general elections and three by-elections since Confederation prior to today's contest has returned a Conservative twelve and a Liberal four times. The former member, David Marshall, was first elected at a by-election in 1906 by a majority of seventy-three, and in the general elections of 1908, 1911 and 1917 his majorities were respectively 247, 394 and 308. The last occasion on which a Liberal captured the seat was in the general election of 1887 when Dr. Wilson polled a majority of fifty-four.

### A Hot Campaign.

Out of approximately 11,000 voters, only about \$,000 voted, many remaining at home owing to the unpleasant weather conditions. The campaign was easily the hottest ever waged in East Elgin. Premier Meighen spoke twice in the riding and a number of government speakers were constantly on the ground. Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King and Hon. T. A. C. Crerar also addressed meetings during the campaign.

A big demonstration was held at Aylmer tonight to mark the success of the Farmers' candidate.

Ottawa, Nov. 22—Announcement of the U. F. O. victory in East Elgin was received in government circles tonight with evident disappointment. Members of the cabinet had gathered in the prime minister's office to receive the returns which as they came in poll by poll, were carefully analyzed and compared. Early returns had indicated likelihood of a government victory, but hopes of such an outcome were gradually dissipated as the majority of Mr. Stansell, the government candidate, gradually dwindled and Mr. McDermid, the farmer candidate took and maintained the lead. A few months ago, a few weeks ago even, a farmer victory in East Elgin would have been regarded as inevitable. But it was hoped that strenuous campaigning had changed this situation.

Vernon, B. C., Nov. 22—With fifteen small isolated points yet to be heard from J. A. MacKelvie, government candidate, has a lead of 182 over his opponent, Colonel C. E. Edgett, D. S. O., independent, endorsed by Liberals.

Farmers, Soldier and Labor in the Yale constituency by-election National Liberal-Conservative officials express confidence that the missing reports will add to Mr. MacKelvie's majority and that his election is assured.

While Vernon gave the government candidate a majority of 294 and Summerland and Grand Forks gave him small majorities, Penticton, Kelowna and Greenwood swung into the opposition column by narrow margins. The country districts were fairly evenly divided, except for the northern part of the constituency, which gave Colonel Edgett a slight advantage.

It may be late before the fifteen missing points can report as the telephone service has been more or less interrupted.

Montreal, Nov. 22—Commenting on the East Elgin result the Montreal Gazette will say:

"The result means a lot to the government on a division in the House of Commons, but a serious matter in one sense, though it would have been better if the constituency had held.

"The causes of the change in sentiment are probably the same as those which put Mr. Drury in power in Ontario. He, (Mr. Meighen) deserved success, if he did not win it in this by-election. The situation makes no difference in his duty, either as head of the government or as chief of the party."

### The Toronto Globe.

Toronto, Nov. 22—The Toronto Globe will say:

"If the vote meant anything—it was strikingly significant—it meant that the electors rejected the Meighen doctrine, that every ballot cast against the government must be counted as a vote for free trade and a fiscal revolution. Even the electors in Aylmer, an industrial town, refused to be deluded, and gave a majority for the Liberal candidate. Mr. Meighen himself went to the constituency to proclaim that the tariff was the issue and the only issue.

"Among the 5,000 who voted for the U. F. O. and Liberal candidates must have been hundreds of farmers who in the past swallowed the protectionists' medicine which the present prime minister again prescribed, but they will take it no longer."

### Phair Was Recaptured.

George Phair sent to the Boys' Industrial Home for complicity in a break at the office of The Coburn Lumber Company, Ripples, last winter, has been recaptured after the second escape from the institution. Phair belonged to Newcastle.

### Sugar Down Again.

The word cheering to all householders, that sugar had declined one cent per pound, was sent out this morning. This latest reduction makes the price per hundredweight \$11.30.

### Meritorious Service Medal.

Sergeant Major Instructor E. J. Ryan, Warrant Officer of the Royal Canadian Regiment, has been awarded the Meritorious Service Medal. Sergeant Major Ryan was in Fredericton as an instructor during the war.

A shipment of eighty to ninety gallons of alcohol seized at Caron Brook, Madawaska County, by Sub-Inspector D'Aigle, arrived here today for storage.
