## WOMAN WITH LONG RECORD FOR LARCENY

Northampton, Dec. 2.—Mrs. Frances M. Davis, 43, of Springfield, was arraigned with a series of larcenies in this city. She confessed to the larceny yesterday of a raccoon skin coat, valued at \$500, the property of Miss Mary McBain of Cleveland, a freshman at Smith College. She was held to the Grand Jury in \$5000 bonds.

Mrs. Davis admitted that she took small sums of money from the room of 20 students at Smith College.

The amounts stolen from the Smith College range from \$1 to \$100. Her method, the authorities say, was to enter the dormitories in pretended search for certain students.

Mrs. Davis, the police say, also confessed to the larceny of \$40 from the treasurer of the Hampden Hampshire Women's Relief Association at a meeting a year ago.

Mrs. Davis was arrested in Greenfield yesterday at the home of a sister. She has a husband who is sick in a hospital in Dover, N. H.

The defendant has a long record of larceny in various parts of the country according to the police.

The police state her first offense was at Los Angeles, Calif., at the time of the great earthquake. She then served a term of 56 days. She next appeared at Greenfield and served six months for larceny, then a year at Laconia, N. H. Then she went to Tucson, Ariz., where she was given a sentence of one year for larceny of a diamond ring. Coming East again, she received sentences of six months to a year at Concord, N. H., Dover, N. H., and Bennington, Vt., the police say.

## PARIS MAY BECOME THE DIVORCE CENTRE

I., offered the smoothest running divorce mill to fashionable Americans tired of marital ties. Later Rockland and Reno, in turn, successfully bid for the business of breaking marriage bonds. Now it seems as though Paris is to have its turn.

Increasing numbers of Americans are turning to the French capital in their desire for freedom. Mrs. Ogden Livingstone Mills, her sister, Mrs. Cyril Hatch, and Mrs. Leonard Thomas, now Mrs. John Barrymore, are a few of the more notable Americans who have obtained divorce decrees from the Tribunal of the Seine this year and, according to Paris attorneys, there will be a continued migration to France of divorce-seeking Americans.

"Paris offers the best facilities for easy divorce of any city in the world," said a French attorney who specializes in divorce suits. "American citizens have far less trouble in obtaining decrees here than they have even in Reno. It is enough for them to come here for a month or two and establish a residence. In the United States the law varies in the various states and the formalities are extremely long and tedious. It is quicker to make the voyage to France and back for a divorce than it is to stay in the United States and try for one. 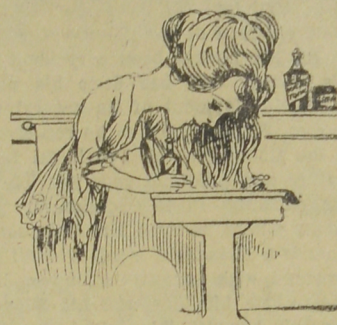

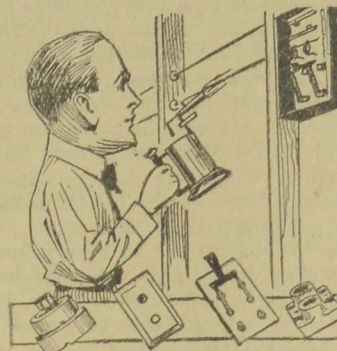

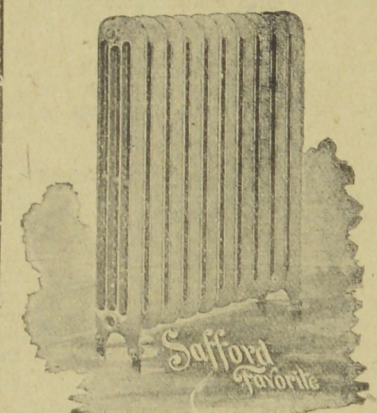

## SURRENDER WAR MATERIAL

Berlin, Nov. 30.—The term for the voluntary surrender of arms and ammunitions in accordance with the Spa convention has expired and owners of arms, etc. not surrendered will now be subject to heavy fines and imprisonment. In Greater Berlin 34,000 rifles, 1064 machine guns and 1960000 cartridges have been given up. In Bavaria 18150 rifles 66 machine guns, 4 artillery guns and large quantities of spare parts were given up in addition to 30,000 cartridges and quantities of explosives.
