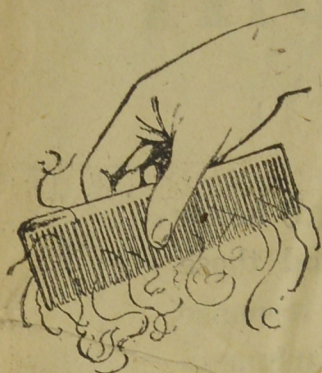

**ORIGINAL PAPAL BULL FOUND**

Berlin, Nov. 5.—By Mail.—The only preserved original of the Bull of 1520 against Luther has been discovered in the Wurtemberg State Archives. The Bull was made in triplicate; two copies were brought to Germany by Dr. Johann Eck, while the third was sent to Charles V. of Spain.

The Bull of excommunication ("Exsurge Domini") against Martin Luther was drawn up in July, 1520, as a result of the appearance in Rome of the doctrines contained in Luther's manifestos, "On the Babylonian Captivity," and "On the Freedom of a Christian Man," and "An Address to the Nobility of the German Nation." Some members of the four consistories to whom they were submitted counselled forbearance, but those demanding summary procedure prevailed. The Bull condemned 41 propositions drawn from Luther's writings, ordered the destruction of the books containing them, and summoned Luther to recant within 60 days or receive the full penalty of ecclesiastical punishment. Dr. Johann Eck, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ingolstadt, who had taken the works to Rome, was commissioned to publish the Bull in Germany. After having been the object of indignities in various German towns, it was consigned to the flames by Luther at Wittenberg.

**ADVISORY BOARD WILL RECOMMEND IN SOME MATTERS**

**Delegation Heard re Pulpwood Export from Crown Lands —Govt. Will Consider Proposal.**

Hon. C. W. Robinson, Minister of Lands and Mines who was here today attending the meeting of the Advisory Board of his department, left Tuesday night for Boston. He will return Thursday.

At the close of the session of the Advisory Board Tuesday evening Col. Loggie the Deputy Minister made an announcement of business transacted at the meeting.

**The Vacancy.**

All members were present. There was one vacancy caused by the death of the late D. J. Buckley. The Lumbermen's Association has been requested to select a member to fill the vacant place as representative of Crown Land lessees.

The term of office of Archibald Fraser as representative of the private timber-limit holders expires December 31. His successor will be appointed after that date.

J. D. Vanderbeck, M. P. P., tendered his resignation as member of the Board of Examiners of Fire Rangers. No appointment will be made to the vacant office until next Board meeting, January 12th.

**Burnt Lumber Question.**

A delegation of limit-holders composed of J. W. Brankley, J. P. Burdill and W. B. Snowball appeared before the Board and asked for permission to export burnt lumber to the United States from Crown Lands as pulpwood. The Act of 1911 forbids export of lumber in the round to the United States the intention being to encourage the manufacture of lumber in this province. The delegation advanced various arguments in support of its request notably that the lumber was in danger of destruction after being burnt unless cut as soon as possible.

The minister informed the delegation that a recommendation on the matter would go to the Lieutenant Governor in Council from the Board.

**Spruce Bud Worm.**

The inroads made by the Spruce Bud Worm in the forests of the province particularly in Northumberland County, were discussed by the Board. A recommendation on this matter will also go to the Lieutenant Governor in Council from the Board.

**LAMBSKINS ARE CHEAPER**

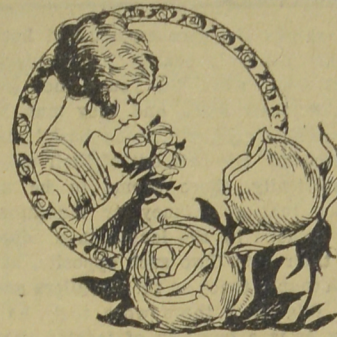
Montreal Nov. 5.—Lamb skins this fall are bringing only a tenth of last year's price but the sensational drop has added seven cents a pound to the cost of the meat according to a butcher of the Bonsecours Market and is partly responsible for the high price of lamb. In November 1919 raw hides could not be purchased for less than \$5.00 each for the first grade skins while today quotations are from 40 cents to 60 cents. Although this abnormal decline should make the cheaper grades of shoes and gloves tumble in price it was stated the immediate effect is to increase the cost of the rest of the carcass and add to the value of the meat.

Unusually heavy export to the United States which has continued longer than was anticipated has also caused lamb to be dearer and the wholesale price went up to two or three cents a pound this week. Local butchers prophesy that the raise will soon be passed on to the housewife, but the market prices are for the time being unaltered.

Butter remains firm and the rates charged by various firms are exhibiting greater uniformity than they showed two weeks ago, when the market was weak. Game is increasing in prices as the hunters are driven in by the cold weather, but with the advancing season the birds are also heavier and the purchaser receives better value than he does for September birds. Turkeys are cheaper in price as corn becomes available at more reasonable rates, and the Barnyard King can now be obtained for nine cents a pound less than last summer. Little change is reported in fruit and vegetables, but the recent winds have blown down a considerable number of apples and placed large consignments of windfalls on the market, it is said.

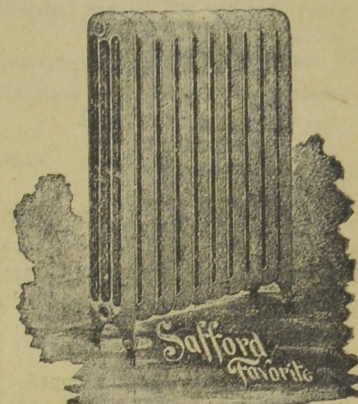

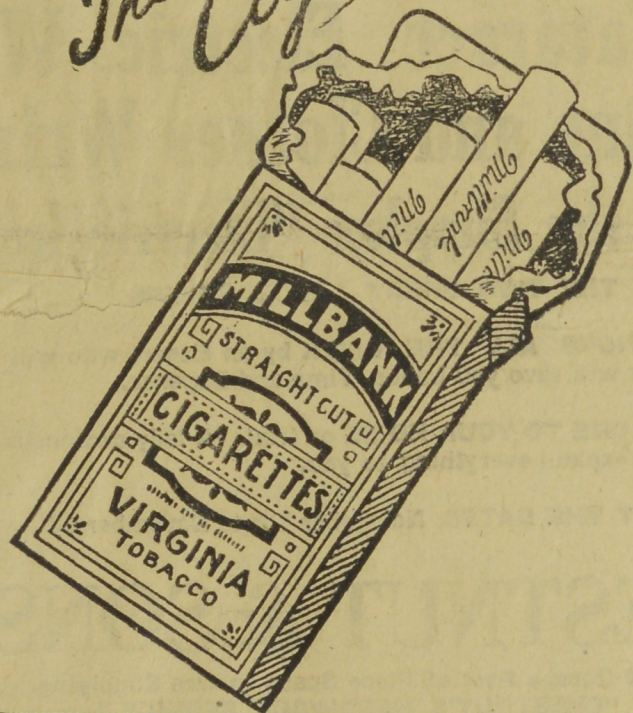

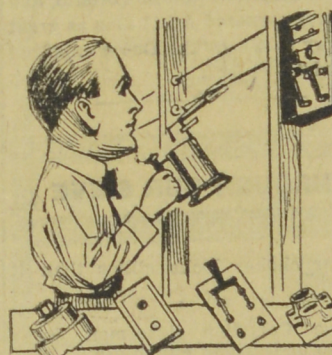
