## LUMBER STOCKS ARE NOW AT A LOW EBB

Winnipeg, Aug. 23.—The fifteen hundred members of the Western Retail Lumbermen's Association on the prairies, report stocks in yards lower than at any period since the war. They report business exceptionally good, but their accounts are mostly with farmers and they can't make collections until after the harvest. Meantime, they are not ordering stock from coast mill men, as banks on the prairies are restricting loans until the crop has been moved. The lumber trade will remain dull, as far as original mill shipments are concerned, until Oct. 15.

Meantime J. E. Pool, secretary of the Mountain Mill Men's Association, is at Ottawa attending the freight rate discussion before the Railway Commission. He went there not to oppose increase, but to see that B. C. mill stock rates to Ontario and other points east are properly equalized with the lumber rates from the Southern States to eastern points.

During the war the Southern pine trade which went into Eastern Canada lost out, and that valuable market was secured for B. C. lumber. It is claimed any advance in lumber rates must be on a basis that will permit this big domestic market and that of Buffalo, Detroit, New York to remain in control B. C. mill products. Unofficial reports from Ottawa to western dealers are that the commission will favorably consider this point.

## TWO DROWNED NEAR HALIFAX

Halifax, Aug. 22.—A tragic double drowning in which Miss Lena Crowell of Halifax and Everett Malcolm, of Newport N. S. lost their lives in Five Islands Lake, St. Margaret's Road, late this afternoon, added two to this summer's already long list of similar casualties. Miss Crowell and young Malcolm neither of whom were expert swimmers waded beyond their depth in an effort to rescue Rachel Hemsworth, another member of their party who was in difficulties a short distance from the shore. Kenneth Sullivan who happened to be bathing nearby in the lake managed to bring Miss Hemsworth safely ashore, but was so exhausted by his efforts that he was unable to attempt a rescue of the others.

A telephone message to the camp of Dr. A. C. Hawkins some distance down the lake brought a party to the spot too late to save Malcolm and Miss Crowell. Three young men of the doctor's party managed with difficulty to recover the bodies.

Miss Crowell was twenty-three years of age. She was the daughter of S. J. Crowell. Malcolm was twenty-five years of age.

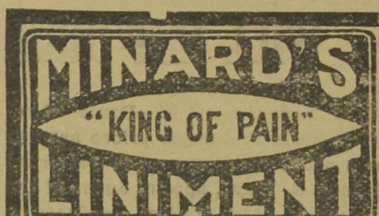
