The jury of women, the first in the history of the city, was very grave as it returned the verdict. Most of the women were weeping openly as the foreman announced the verdict.

Cornell was released on his own recognizance, County Detective Watson announcing he would prefer a charge of involuntary manslaughter against him.

WILL HAVE OPPOSITION

Montreal, Nov. 26.—Rumor was still busy in political circles this morning coupling the name of L. J. Gauthier, M. P., for St. Hyacinthe-Rouville with the post of future Minister of Railways in the Meighen administration. It was even stated that Mr. Gauthier might be sworn in tomorrow at Ottawa.

The Liberal are active, and working upon the theory that the news should prove true, they have already decided it is said, upon Edmond Robert, M. L. A., for Rouville county, to oppose Mr. Gauthier in the by-election which would be necessitated by the latter's acceptance of an portfolio in the Federal Government. In this case, it is stated, Mr. Robert would be asked to resign his present mandate as M. L. A. to oppose Mr. Gauthier.

BY-ELECTION IN WEST PETERBORO COMING SOON

Ottawa, Nov. 26.—With the smoke of battle in East Elgin and Yale clearing away, attention is being directed to the one remaining by-election, West Peterboro. The seat has been vacant since last summer and the date of the election is expected to be announced this week. If the new member is to take his seat at the start of the January session of Parliament it will be necessary to issue the writs almost immediately as under the new Franchise Act and the delays it provides for, at least fifty days is needed between the proclamation and the voting.

In the light of what has happened in East Elgin, particular interest will attach to the coming battle in this other Ontario constituency.

It is vacant under peculiar conditions, the resignation of "Ham" Burnham, M. P., because he considered that his mandate as a Unionist had expired. His doing so and the reasons he has given are somewhat of an embarrassment to those who hold that Mr. Burnham's position was not justified. In consequence, though he is again in the field, it is very doubtful if the Government places upon him the seal of its approval. There is reason to believe that some other candidate will be sought.

The U. F. O. have a candidate in the field. West Peterboro which includes the city is thus a combination of urban and rural vote and will present a different situation from East Elgin.

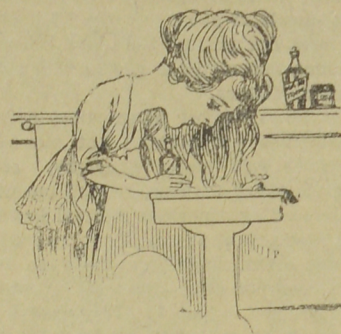
WHICH WAY DO YOU SLEEP?

"Change your bed with the head north or south and you'll sleep better."

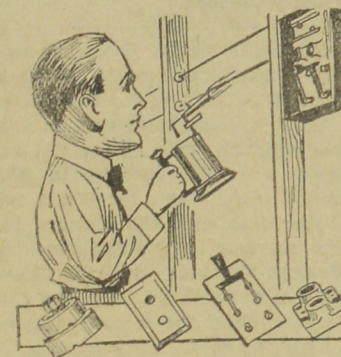

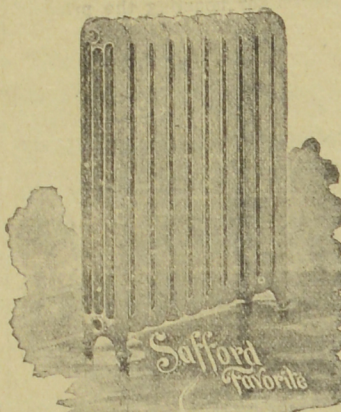
