TORONTO MEN FOR BOSTON MARATHON

Capt. Elwood Hughes Claims
He Has a Couple of Likely
Ones—Trained Sherring and Corkery

Boston, March 22.—Capt. Elwood Hughes, of Toronto, who was in a large measure responsible for the wonderful record made by Billy Sherring as a Marathon runner, has reported that he will bring one or two men to Boston Patriot's Day for the B. A. A. Marathon.

Sherring, it will be recalled, won the Olympic Marathon at Athens in 1906, after which he was given a position for life in the northern country.

Hughes later developed Tom Corkery, who also competed in the Boston race, and afterward won the Hamilton Spectator race, which carried with it a trip to London in 1912, and to the Swedish Olympics at Stockholm the same year.

Hughes is a great student of long-distance running, and is one of the most popular athletic followers in Canada. He does not say whom he will bring to Boston, but Manager George V. Brown of the B. A. A. feels that he will have at least one man who will make it interesting for all.

CANADIAN OLYMPIC TEAM SAILS APRIL 3

Allan Cup Winners, Runners-up or Third in Line Will Go—Leave from St. John.

Toronto, March 22.—On March 29 the Canadian amateur championship will be decided here, and the successful team will sail from St. John four days later for Belgium. Passage has been booked on the Melita, and it is expected that the Allan Cup holders will arrive in Brussels where the Olympic series will be played, four days before the opening game.

W. A. Hewitt Secretary of the C.A. H. A. and the O. H. A. has been selected to represent the Canadian Hockey Association and Canadian Olympic Committee in Belgium. He will accompany the team. Eleven men, not counting Mr. Hewitt, will make the trip.

Sudbury, Granites and Falcons, three of the teams still in the running have announced their willingness to represent Canada should they be successful in winning the championship. University of Toronto have not stated their intentions. In case the Allan Cup winners find that they will be unable to go the runners-up will be sent. It will be a team, not an all-star collection, that will carry Canada's colors at the Olympiad.

Falcons have requested that, in case they are victorious, permission be granted them to make a flying visit to Winnipeg before setting sail, but this it is impossible to give. The team, whether it be the champions, the runners-up, or the next in line, will sail on the Melita on April 3. There is no possibility of passage being secured on any other boat.

The Allan Cup receipts will be used to help defray the expenses of the champions.
