Greece under Premier Venizelos secured permission from the powers to take Thrice and the coast of Asia Minor. Both regions were occupied and things looked bright for a time. Then came the death of King Alexander and the defeat of Venizelos and the recall of King Constantine to the throne. The Greeks are appparently tired of the Cretan statesman with his strong minded and strong arm methods. The return of Constantine to the throne is likely to cause some uneasiness and is not looked upon with favor by the entente nations.

While the League of Nations was the outstanding issue, incompetency shown by the Democratic administration in connection with the war undoubtedly contributed to the sweeping Republican victory at the polls. 
