

CREOLE SAUCE.

Cook two tablespoons of chopped nion and one-fourth cup of chopped green pepper in two tablespoons of butter five minutes; add two medium sized tomatoes cut in small pieces (or one-half cup of thick tomato puree), one-fourth cup of sliced mushrooms and eight stoned and chopped olives; ontinue cooking three minutes. Have eady one and one half cups of plain brown sauce; add the first mixture Bring to boiling point, season with salt and pepper and pour around broiled fillet of beef or sirlion steak.

GRAPE SHERBET.

Make a syrup by boiling four cups f water and two cups of sugar fifteen minutes; add two cups of grape juice three-fourths cup of orange juice and one-fourth cup of lemon juice Freeze to a mush (allowing three measures of crushed ice to one of rock salt). Then fold in the whites of two eggs beaten until stiff; continue freezing.

Cook potatoes in their "jackets" in boiling salted water until tender; drain, and when cool, peel and cut in one-fourth inch cubes; there should be three cups. Pour over two and onehalf cups of thin white sauce to which


