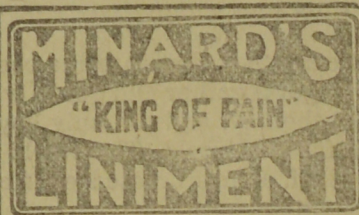

## NEW TIME ALLOWANCE FOR HORSES

"Unshackling" Rule of Little  
Interest in New England—  
Tracks Want Lots of  
Racing.

Boston Globe: Horses with winning race records made previous to 1919 racing over National Trotting Association tracks are to be classified under a new time allowance rule that gives a horse the advantage of two seconds a year up to three years for every season in which it does not equal its best win race performance.

This new time allowance rule was added to the code of the National Association last Saturday at Canton, O., after the board of review had killed the rule which would have permitted a fast record horse to drop back to the 2.12 class two years after getting its life mark.

As practically all of the New England tracks are in the National Association the new time allowance will be in force on the Bay State Circuit. While it is more liberal than the old rule of one second a year its adoption will cause little comment in this section.

The "unshackling" rule just rescinded, while bitterly opposed in many places, hardly raised a ripple in New England. Our owners and trainers want to race horses and care very little about some of the things that bother men elsewhere a lot. Our track managers making a game fight to get over the grade, feel they are doing fairly well under the handicaps and they too, are not given to worrying about the time-allowance rule.

## TO ELIMINATE DELIVERIES NOT STRAIGHT GOODS

Ban Johnson Says the Public  
Wants More Hitting and  
Will Get It—Specific Rules.

Chicago, Feb. 3.—Ban Johnson, President of the American League says:

"All freak deliveries, spit ball, shine ball and doctoring the ball in any way will be eliminated by the rules committee next month. The public has been clamoring for more hitting for years and we are going to give it to them by eliminating all freak deliveries."

"The opinion seems to be that the abolition of the spit ball and shine ball will give the fans the sort of ball they desire. We are going to find out whether it will."

"I do not expect any trouble. The American Association had no difficulty in stopping its pitchers from using it and, therefore, I do not believe the umpires in the major leagues will experience any trouble in stopping the pitchers from using either the spit ball or shine ball. There will be specific rules to govern both and they will be enforced."

## DID NOT VISIT PROVINCES

He has, however made enquiries about conditions in the Provinces, and has been supplied with the necessary information as to the number of tracks, meetings, size of purses and other conditions.

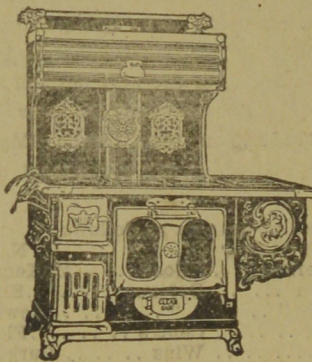

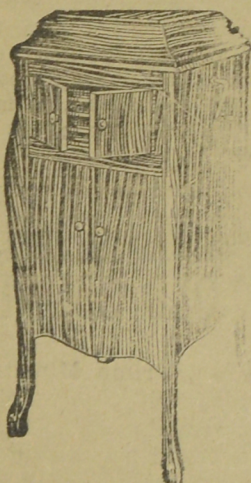
