

Melt three squares of chocolate in a small saucepan set in a larger sauce pan containing boiling water. Add two and one-half teaspoons of melted butter and three tablespoons of boiling

water; stir until mixture becomes gran ular, then add sifted confectioners sugar until smooth, glossy and of the ight consistency to spread. Add onenalf teaspoon of vanilla extract and spread at once over top and sides of ake. If the frosting appears too thick, add boiling water drop by drop until it will spread without running off the sides of the cake. This frosting will glaze over the top but remains soft and creamy underneath the glaze.


