## ATTENDANCE AT CURTAIN RAISER HARNESS MEET DOMINION DAY IS DECLARED TO BE A RECORD

Four Interesting Races Witnessed by Big Crowd—Victoria Dis-  
tanced in 2.17 Trot After Accident to Sulky—H. C. Jewett  
Declined to Agree to the Mare Starting in the Next Heat—  
Same Owner Alleged That Fred Cameron Carried The Ex-  
poser Wide in Last Heat of Free-for-All.

What the track management claims is the largest number of paid admissions on record passed the gate at the Fredericton Trotting Park on the afternoon of Dominion Day to attend the "curtain raiser" of the season of 1920. Paid admissions numbered well up to thirteen hundred. The crowd saw good racing. Notwithstanding the heavy rain of the previous day the track was in pretty good condition. The start was delayed half an hour to give it more time to dry out. Extraordinarily fast time could not be expected and was not made but the races all were of interest. A ball game in the centre of the track and band music by the Fredericton Brass Band helped pass away the time between heats.

### Unusual Incidents

During the afternoon there were two unusual incidents. Victoria the fast mare owned by Dr. McAlister ex-M. P. of Sussex was distanced in the first heat of the 2.17 Trot. It was through no fault of the horse or driver but through accident. One of the tires came off the sulky. Driver Fred Cameron finished the first half on the rim of one wheel and did not drive hard in the second lap. The result he got the flag. Regulations call for the unanimous consent of the other drivers for a distanced horse to start in the next heat. H. C. Jewett of this city driving Border Prince declined to agree to let Victoria start and she was withdrawn. The incident naturally was annoying to Dr. McAlister and he is quoted as saying that he would not start his horses here or in races in which Mr. Jewett has horses entered. Last night it was reported however that the Doctor had changed his mind and was not angry.

In the Free-for-All, third heat, horses from the same two stables again caused friction between the owners. Mr. Jewett claimed that Driver Fred Cameron up behind Dr. McAlister's Fern Hal carried The Exposer wide on the last turn and coming into the stretch. Patrol judges had been put out to observe just such occurrences but did not report this, although the grand stand thought it looked as though such had taken place. Mr. Jewett's protest was too late however the result of the heat having been announced to his approaching the officials' stand.

### One Great Heat

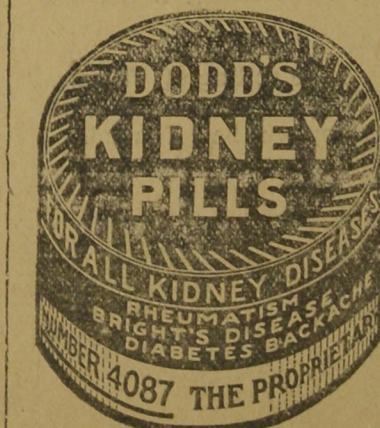
