### DAILY FOODS FOR SUMMER

In preparing the menu for summer days it is well to remember that sultry nights and long, languorous hours of heat produce a relaxed condition in the whole body—a sort of torpor, which must be overcome before food can be digested and the digestive organs stimulant than a hot soup or bouillon served with cream. Either will stimulate the gastric juices and pave the way for the assimilation of solid food. On the other hand ice cream and iced drinks, which during the actual moment of eating produce a passing sensation of coolness, are in reality heating because they chill the stomach, and digestion is consequently retarded. The sudden cold checks the flow of perspiration and waste products, ordinarily expelled through the pores, are retained. So you can never go wrong in serving soup.

While strawberries are still in season there is no greater treat than the real old fashioned strawberry shortcake—the kind grandmother used to make—the kind you don't get in the restaurant. For this take two and a half cups of flour, four teaspoonfuls baking powder, half a teaspoonful salt, one tablespoonful sugar, one cup milk three tablespoonfuls butter. Mix the dry ingredients together thoroughly. Work in the shortening with the finger tips and add the milk slowly. Toss on a floured board, divide in two parts pat out and fit into pans. Bake fifteen minutes in a hot oven. Split and butter liberally and fill with halved strawberries which have been allowed to stand in sugar—about a cupful to a quart of berries. Pile berries on top and serve warm, with or without cream.

While pineapple is in season one should take advantage of it as a salad at least. It makes a delightfully refreshing dish for hot days. For this remove the skin and eyes from a pineapple. Chop the pulp into thin, small slices, dress with honey dressing and let stand thirty minutes. Serve on lettuce leaves. For the dressing use one-quarter cup olive oil, three tablespoonfuls honey, two tablespoonfuls lemon juice and a few grains of salt. Beat together until frothy and use at once.

## FAVOR AN EARLY APPEAL

Ottawa, June 27.—Commenting upon the resignation from the Board of Commerce of Mr. James Murdock, The Ottawa Journal edited by Mr. P. D. Ross, a close personal friend of Sir Robert Borden, says editorially in its Saturday issue that, failing a definite statement by the Union Government on the questions of policy and leadership, "a general election is

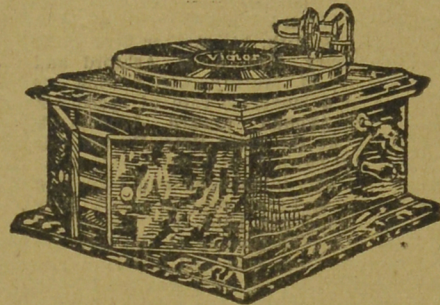
due to the people at an early date, and we imagine has come to be desirable this year in any case."

The editorial reads as follows: "The resignation of Mr. Murdock from the Board of Commerce and his accompanying letter, seem to illustrate the difficulty if not the mistake, of attempting to carry on Government without a definite and present leadership. The endeavor of the Unionists to carry on last winter under the necessity of Sir Robert Borden's absence was a tribute to his personality, and creditable to the heart of the party, but apparently it

rendered inevitable an uncertainty in administration which has afforded ground for irritation in various quarters of which the Board of Commerce has been one of the most important. If it is possible to end the uncertainty by definite announcement about the Union leadership and Union platform this should be done, otherwise a general election is due to the people at an early date, and we imagine has come to be desirable this year in any case."
