BROWN BETTY PUDDING.

Three medium sized tar taplles, 1 cup stale bread crumbs, quarter cup of butter, quarter cup of sugar, half teaspoon cinnamon, juice and rind of half a lemon and quarter cup of boiling water.

Pare, quarter, core and slice the apples. Melt the butter and pour it FREDERICTON, N. B. with the lemon juice over the crumbs. Mix the cinnamon, grated demon rind and sugar together. Butter a baking dish, put in alternate layers of apple and bread crumbs, sprinkling the apples with sugar mixture, making the last layer of crumbs. Pour the water 532 Queen Street, Fredericton, N. B. on before adding the last layer of crumbs; cover and bake for thirty minutes or until the apples are soft, then uncover and brown the crumbs


