THE TEACHER SHORTAGE

Newspapers in many parts of Car ada says Toronto Saturday Night, are emanating originally from the St. Catharines, Ont. branch of the National Council of Women, that an effort be made to recruit the depleted ranks of the school teachers by importing surplus teachers from Great Britain and utilizing trained British teachers now residing in Canada, who have been compelled to turn to other callings. The teacher shortage is common to every part of Canada; but no one wants to see a policy adopted which would enable imported teachers to undersell Canadians, educated partly at the public expense, and already poorly remunerated. If, however, there is in any province a considerable body of British trained teachers, wno desire to engage in the calling here, there is no good reason why they should not be licensed on condition that they furnish proofs of having acquired a working knowledge of Canadian history and the Canadian constitution.
