### WORTH REMEMBERING

Attractive numbers for card tables can be made by enameling common house numbers with black enamel, then painting a little flower design on them, with oil paints.

The average girl, country or city knows little of the value of cucumbers as a complexion beautifier. Peel a cucumber thickly and rub over the face, allowing the juice to dry on of its own accord. This will make the skin soft and white, if used often enough.

Mustard should always be mixed with a little salt. Put the mustard in the cup with a pinch of salt and add the water gradually until you have a smooth paste. You can then make it as thin as you like.

Hartshorn will restore colors taken out by acids.

A polish for furniture and woodwork may be made from equal parts of turpentine, kerosene and vinegar, well blended. This is not only cheap and gettable, but as good as can be purchased.

A dust mop for wiping hardwood floor-borders requires only the general-store variety of mop, and 20 cents' worth of paraffin oil. Soak the mop in the oil until thoroughly saturated, dry and use four or five months then wash and oil again.

To make oilcloth that has worn off the pattern look like new give it a coat of carriage paint, and follow with two coats of varnish.

### GOLD CAKE.

1 cup butter or substitute.  
1 cup sugar.  
3 egg-yolks.  
1 egg-white.  
½ cup milk.  
1½ cups flour.  
2 teaspoonfuls of baking powder.  
Pinch salt.  
1 teaspoonful vanilla.  
Warm the shortening, beat with the sugar until creamy, add egg-yolks, next the liquid and sifted dry ingredients. Whole amount of beating should not be more than two minutes. Lastly add vanilla and fold in the stiffly beaten egg-white. Bake in a moderate oven for 45 minutes.

## EARL MINTO A GOOD FARMER

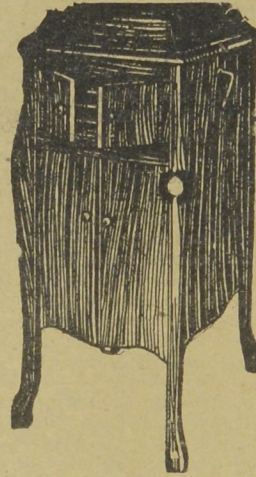
Winnipeg July 8.—One of the most active farmers in Alberta this year is the young Earl of Minto son of a former Governor-General of Canada who has purchased 4,000 acres of land six miles from the town of Nanton, near Calgary, and not far from the newly acquired ranch of the Prince of Wales. The Earl has 500 acres seeded in oats. Next year he will put in a large area to wheat. He will also import from England Lincolnshire red shorthorn

cattle, which animals are great milkers. Cheviot sheep will also be brought in. Many of the sheep he is bringing in are first prize winners at the principal shows in Scotland. The Earl expects that many other large land owners will follow his example and come out to western Canada as practical farmers and stock raisers. The land tax in Great Britain at the present time is 7s. 6d. on the pound and there is also a supertax, bringing the tax up to 15s. Land owners in Great Britain are, therefore, hard hit.

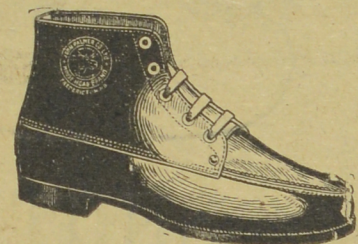
