RESOLUTION ON MYERS HISTORY

Graham L. O. L. on Record as Opposing use of Text-book in Schools of Province.

Graham L. O. L. No. 20 at a regular meeting Monday night passed the following resolution with regard to Myers' General History, the use of an added chapter of which touching upon the Great War, has been banned by the Provincial Department of Education:

"Whereas Myers' General History is a text-book prescribed for use in the Public Schools of New Brunswick and whereas the part of the history lately added purporting to record the events of the late World War speaks disparagingly of the war efforts of the British Empire as compared with the successes achieved by the United States and makes no especial detail or record of the part taken by the Canadian soldiers.

Therefore resolved that Graham L. O. L. No. 20 place itself on record as opposed to the use of the said history as a text-book in the schools and recommend that one in sympathy with British aims and ideals be substituted therefore.

GENTLEMEN'S AGREEMENT WILL STAND

Chicago, Feb. 17.—The major and minor baseball leagues decided at their joint meeting here to continue to work under the 'gentlemen's' agreement which prevailed last year with one change—the appointment of an arbitration board to handle all disputes. This board will consist of two members, the chairman of the National Commission and one representative from the minor leagues. A third referee, a man not connected with any baseball organization, will be chosen to cast the deciding vote in case of a deadlock.

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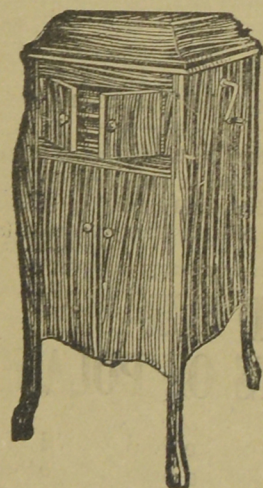

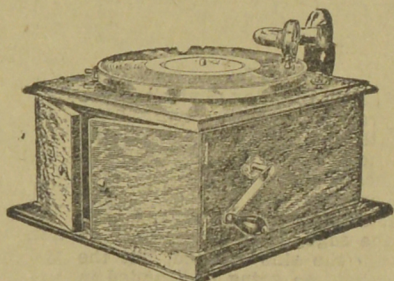
