BIG SECTION WILL BE DRY IN FEBRUARY

Ottawa, Dec. 23—Final figures for the four provinces which voted themselves bone-dry on October 25, have been received at the capital. They will be officially gazetted within the next few days. As it is expected that at least thirty days and perhaps six weeks will be allowed to elapse after the returns are gazetted before the necessary proclamation is issued giving effect to the voting it will probably be some time in February before the control of the liquor traffic passes entirely to the provinces.

The returns show that a very large proportion of the people on the voters list did not cast their ballots. In Nova Scotia the combined affirmative and negative vote was less than fifty per cent of the total. In the western provinces the percentage of the vote cast was somewhat higher.

The figures for the four provinces follow:

Nova Scotia—Affirmative 83,422; negative 23,874; total, 107,296. Total number of names on the voters list, 265,275.

Manitoba—Affirmative, 68,831; negative 55,065; total 123,897. Total number of names on the voters list 218,908.

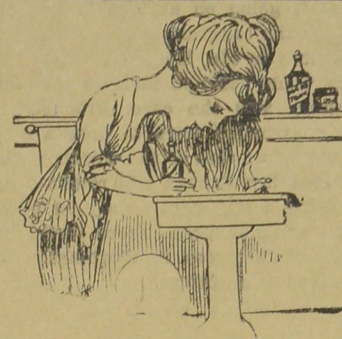
Saskatchewan—Affirmative, 86,949; negative 55,257; total, 142,206. Total number of names on the voters list, 275,958.

Alberta—Affirmative 63,012; negative, 44,321; total, 107,333. Total number of names on the voters' list, 201,374.

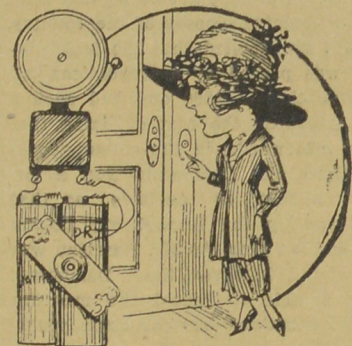
