

#### Viviani Hopeful

Paris, Dec. 26-Former Premier Rene Viviani spoke optimistically of the future of the league of nations on Friday in giving to the foreign affairs committee of the chamber on account of the recent assembly of the league at Geneva at which he was a French delegate. France, he said, probably would not hesitate to present for consideration to the committee as amend ment to the covenant the proposition of Leon Bourgeois to give the league an armed force. He declared that the league at the present time must not be considered as destined solely by its own force to preserve the world from war but expressed the opinion that those sceptical of its utility were "quite wrong."

"I conceive the role of the league at present." M. Viviani continued. "to me that of a great moral unit that will be all the more powerful in proportion as it is prudent in its act


