## HON MACKENZIE KING AT THE TRAVELLERS BANQUET

Commercial Men are the Vital Link Between the

C. P. R., he expressed gratitude that  
the deficit of the C. P. R. was not  
equal to that of the National Rail-  
ways.

There were two or three features of  
this organization he said which im-  
pressed him. No other society had  
such a splendid membership except  
perhaps the Trades and Labor Con-  
gress. With its nearly eleven thou-  
country they were not only big in  
and members, spread all over the  
country, they were not only big in  
numbers, but they were the human  
and vital link between the manufac-  
turing and consuming agencies of the  
country.

There was no danger looming up  
ahead, he thought, so much as that  
of class organization, but many who  
fear that class organization overlook-  
ed some features of its coming into be-  
ing. He raised no question of motives  
but it was a remarkable fact that the  
ministry which then went into power  
in 1917, was mostly a ministry of  
lawyers, and going through the pro-  
vinces from East to West of the Do-  
minion, Mr. King named one Minis-  
ter after another who, he said, was a  
lawyer. That was an example, he  
thought of class organization, against  
which in itself he had nothing to say,  
"but was it any wonder that the farm-  
ers and labor of the country was to  
be run by any one class it might as  
well be theirs?" He did not wish to  
recit on the importance of lawyers,  
who were essential to the work of the  
country, but he did not think it good  
that the country should be run by  
them. What he wanted to see was  
the community controlled by all clas-  
ses in unison by all groups of the  
nation as a whole.

To this gathering, interested in  
large business, he would say, where  
you have large powers, numbers and  
wealth, there existed always a strong  
determination to gain power. That  
was what made them fear the power  
of labor and of the farmers.

No Clash Likely

But he did not think that these  
three powers were going to clash in  
the government of the country.  
"There is something more powerful  
than any organization," he said, "the  
hatred of any control and an ydomi-  
nation, no matter where it might be.  
Leaders had seen this danger, and to  
cope with it were trying to widen the  
basis of their parties. "In the great  
stretching of national parties across  
the continent," said Hon. Mr. King  
"we have a safeguard against domina-  
tion by any one organization."

There was no danger in big organi-  
zations as such, it was only when as  
groups they desired to dominate that  
the Liberal party opposed them.

This association of travellers he be-  
lieved was in a better position than  
any other organization to gauge the  
opinion and feeling of the country, for  
they were moving up and down the  
country all the time. Public opinion  
as expressed by this organization was  
better than as expressed by the press  
he thought for there was liable to be  
bias in the latter, part of which was  
controlled by party men. He claimed  
that it would be a benefit to Parlia-  
ment to have more representatives of  
this association in the House.

Dealing with present and future  
needs, Hon. Mr. King, said that it  
was necessary now to repair the rav-  
ages of war by works of peace, by  
economy in work and resources, and  
by preservation of human life and by  
bringing good-will amongst the men  
and nations of the world, as an anti-  
dote to the ill-will produced by the  
war.

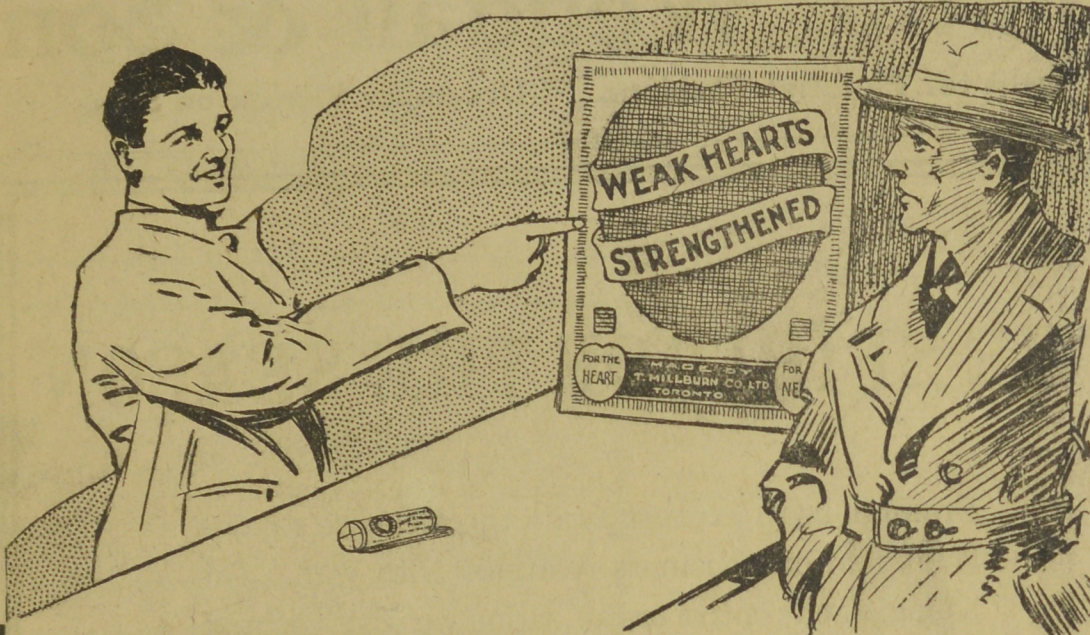
