RUSSIAN PEASANT LIVING IN STYLE

"One of the peculiarities of our topsy-turvy life in Russia now," says a letter from Petrograd, mailed in a roundabout way a few months ago, "is that the peasant villagers are assuming all the refinements that were found only in the cities heretofore, and are acquiring all the luxuries, silks, ribbons and even grand pianos that once belonged to the city, exchanged now by the city for food."

"The peasants come to the city bringing food, and bringing also their list of the things they want. They examine the quarters of the bourgeoisie critically; they demand nickel plated beds of spacious proportions and with spring mattresses; they will consider none but those made of the softest wool; they select the finest dresses and one ambitious villager specified that the piano which he wanted must be a baby grand to fit the corner in his kitchen, where he intended to put it. "Moving picture houses, theatres and music halls have been built hurriedly in the villages, and are flourishing, while those in the city are falling into ruin."

BANDITS MADE A BIG HAUL

Chicago, Oct. 31.—The boldest and most successful of many raids by automobile bandits was staged yesterday at 16th street and Archer avenue when a bank messenger was robbed of \$50,000 in cash. The messenger was mortally wounded.

At 16th Street Yanowicz slowed up for a stretch of bad pavement. Before he could put on speed again a blue car had slid up beside the bank machine and the chauffeur and policeman were staring down the barrels of two automatics. Yanowicz dropped the steering wheel and reached for his revolver. One of the pistols barked and the chauffeur crumpled up.

Leonard also reached for his gun and a bullet struck him in the chest glancing off a nail file in his breast pocket. He replied and he thinks he hit one of the bandits. By this time the two others had secured the satchel containing the \$50,000 and the blue motor car was again under way.

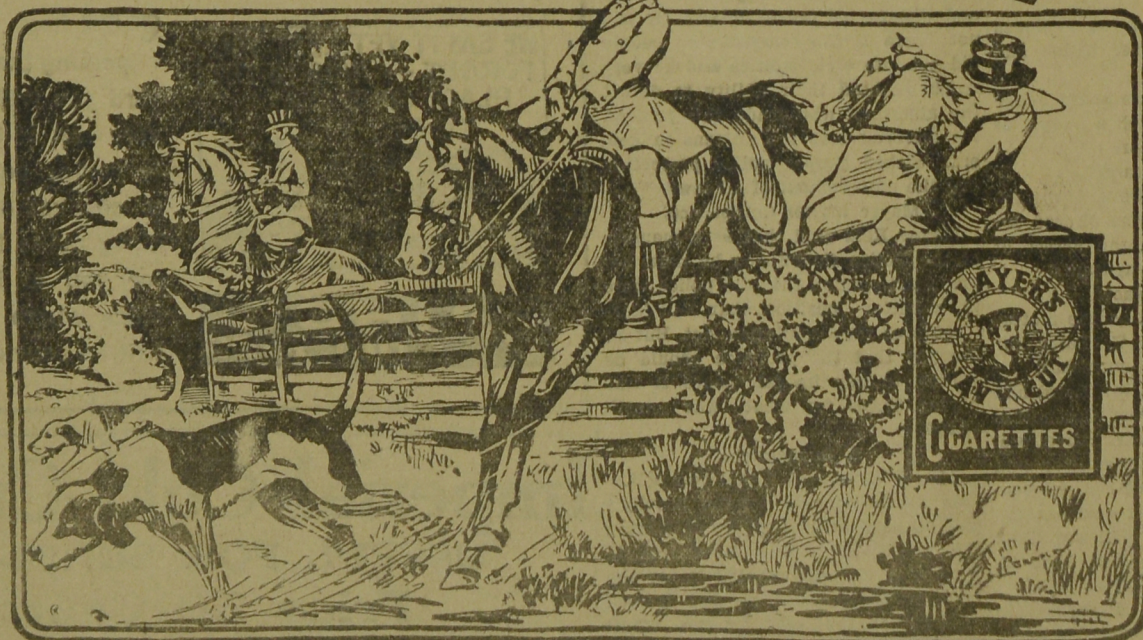
