



With a bit of careful planning the rudent housewife may triple the food values of a smoked ham of four pounds, meaning either a small ham -not a shoulder known as a callyor half a large ham.

Begin serving your ham on Sunday Boil it slowly about two hours, after having given it a fifteen mInute spurt on a high flame. Remove from the cooking pot and place it in a roasting pan after having removed the rind. insert about eight cloves in top of ham and sprinkle with brown sugar and very fine breadcrumbs. Add about one-half cup vinegar to one cup of the stock in which the ham was bolled and use this in basting. Serve with spinach or green beans, baked sweet or white potatoes or any desired vege-

As a leftover the ham is served cold or it can be reheated in the oven if desired, and augmented with a most delicious warm potato salad. 
