Washington, June 8-Senator David Walsh's resolution, calling for infor mation concerning exportation of coa and its relation to the New England fuel crisis, was passed by the Senate today.

"It is the first official step directed to obtain evidence which would justify an embargo by the government," said the Massachusets Senator.

"While the Interstate Commerce Commission is merely requested to in vestigate the causes of the acute short age, it is my opinion, after a consulta tion today with some of its members virtue of the powers residing in that body to take whatever action is neces sary to remove any obstacles to the steady and continued flow of trade.

"I feel confident that the investigation will lead to an embargo declared by this commission. Whether the commission can act or fails to act will not ultimately determine the issurance of a coal embargo order, for as soon as the investigation proves that the situation is serious enough to warrent action, the President will be requested to exercise his powers and place restrictive measures on the further exportation of coal.
