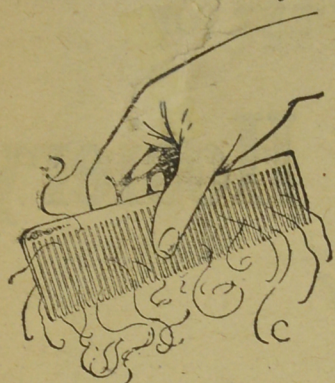

Rome, June 8.—The ceremony of beatification of 22 negroes who died martyrs for the faith in Uganda under King Mwanga was celebrated today with great pomp in the Basilica of St. Peter's. ## WOMAN FITTED TO HOLD OFFICE

Cleveland, June 4.—"I believe that women should be in every political convention." That it Miss Helen Taft's view of the important part women should play in politics. "But I do not believe," she adds, "that a married woman with children should hold any office. I cannot guess whether any woman ever will become President, but women are capable of filling every office that men can."

Miss Taft discussed women's progress in politics while speaking here to aid the campaign to raise an endowment fund of \$2,000,000 for Bryn Mawr College, of which Miss Taft is acting president. She is, incidentally, the youngest college president in the United States.

Discussing the low salaries of educators in general, she said:

"Unless money can be raised at once for increasing the salaries of faculties in women colleges, the number of professors will be reduced one-half by the end of the present year."

"The professors are going into more remunerative occupations because they find that even with every sacrifice, by falling back on their savings and borrowing money, the \$3,000 a year paid a full professor and the \$1,800 paid an instructor is not enough to compete with increased cost of living."

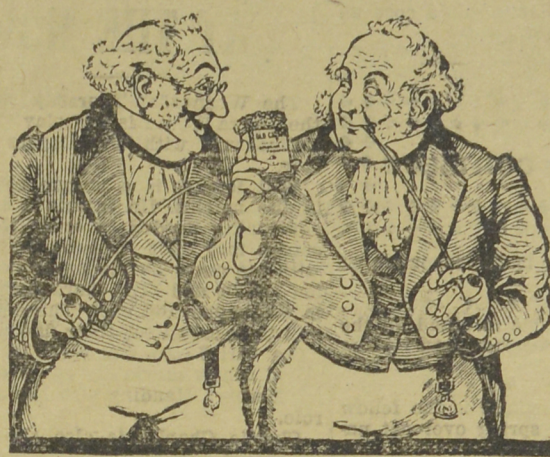

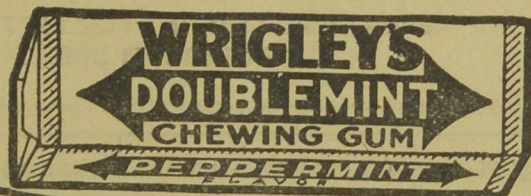

## HORSE DOCTOR ATTENDS PET DOGS AND GOLDFISH

New York, June 7.—It may not occur to the average person that the dog practitioner employs the same methods, obtaining a history of the family which owns the dog in lieu of a history of the animal's own family, modern dogs not being burdened with such things. The dog is known for acquiring the diseases of his master as well as his traits. And the modern veterinarian with a dog practice works on the theory that the dog eats with the family, retires with it, and usually what affects the family will affect the dog. During the flu epidemic the dog doctor was as busy as the family doctor.

"It is the highly pampered city dog which is most often taken sick," says a veterinarian with a large dog practice. "The animal may be worth nothing or it may be worth hundreds of dollars, but it has to be treated. For there is no value on sentiment, and the persons who aren't sentimental about their dogs don't have them."

He believes that would be very little illness among both dogs and humans if they fed properly.

A dog is ailing and the dog doctor is called on the phone.

"My dog is not acting right. I wish you would come and see him or tell me what to do."

"You have no other dog in family, madame?"

"Oh, no, and I don't see how Fido could have caught anything from any other dog, because I always take him out on a chain."

"Do you take him out yourself, or does some other member of the family?" asks the veterinarian, compiling Fido's history.

Madame does not see the import of this question, but is ever ready with information on Fido.

"My husband takes him out occasionally, but not often. My husband is too stout to like walking and Fido needs such a lot of exercise; he is growing stout too. My husband loves him, though as much as I do, and feeds him all the time."

That is Fido's history. Fido is a good dog and has acquired fat like one of his masters. He is suffering from obesity. Exercise and reduced, selected diet are prescribed.

Doctoring the Gold Fish.

The dog doctor needs must be a highly versatile practitioner. For when it is known that he cures dogs and cats of various maladies he is called in

to treat almost any pet. Canaries may be his patients as frequently as dogs, and it is more than once a year that he is called in to tell the family what is ailing the bowl of goldfish.

If the sides of the fish are compressed and the edges of the tail seem to be dropping off it has tuberculosis. With this disease it may also be voraciously hungry at times, then without appetite at others.

Says the versatile practitioner: "It is not absolutely necessary for the fish to die; I'll see what I can do."

Perhaps he prescribes a salt water bath. If the fish has dropsy, itch or fungous disease or bladder complaint he may still give the salt water bath or else permanganate of potash or
