#### HINTS TO HOUSEWIVES.

Bread griddle cakes are an economical way of using up stale bread.

Oily fish are more nourishing but not quite so digestible as non-oily kinds.

Desserts made with dates, raisins and other sweet fruits require practically no sugar.

Minced watercress and diced tart apples make delicious salad with oil and vinegar for a dressing.

Do not have the oven too hot when cakes are to be baked. Allow the cake to rise in a moderate oven, then make the oven hot to brown it.

Fern boxes if fastened around the porch railing or wall, will prove more satisfactory than flower boxes, as the ferns do not harbor mosquitoes and insects to the extent that the flowers do.

New walking shoes often blister the heels of their wearer by slipping a little with the movement of the foot. To prevent this, rub the inside of the shoes at the heel with soap just before putting them on.

#### MAPLE SUGAR ROLLS.

Mix baking powder biscuit dough, roll one-half inch thick, spread with dry maple sugar, scrapped or ground fine; roll up like jelly roll, cut in slices one inch thick; lay close together in biscuit tin and bake in hot oven.

### PERSHING'S WARM WELCOME AT AUGUSTA

Augusta, Me., June 8—City Hall was crowded tonight to greet Gen. Pershing. The meeting was delayed nearly an hour owing to his late arrival and the dinner that immediately followed at the Blaine mansion, at which were present a number of present and ex-State officials.

Mayor Martin presided and first introduced Commander Donald C. Metcalf of the Augusta Post of the American Legion, who was followed by Lieut. Col. Albert Grenlaw, division commander of Maine. Gov. Milliken was called upon to present the distinguished guest of the evening and he did it eloquently recalling briefly the splendid informal reception to the citizens.

Gen. Pershing was accorded an ovation when he rose to speak. He spoke of the pleasure it had given him to see the cities and towns of Maine and the delight it had afforded him to meet Maine people.

## BISCUITS, BUNS and ROLLS

#### Biscuits

2 cups flour  
4 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
3 tablespoons shortening  
1/2 cup milk or half milk and half water

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt, add shortening and rub in very lightly; add liquid slowly; roll or pat on floured board to about one inch in thickness (handle as little as possible); cut with biscuit cutter. Bake in hot oven 15 to 20 minutes.

#### Royal Cinnamon Buns

2 1/2 cups flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
4 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder  
2 tablespoons shortening  
1 egg  
1/2 cup water  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 teaspoons cinnamon  
4 tablespoons seeded raisins

Sift 2 tablespoons of measured sugar with flour, salt and baking powder; rub shortening in lightly; add beaten egg to water and add slowly. Roll out 1/2 inch

thick on floured board; brush with melted butter, sprinkle with sugar, cinnamon and raisins. Roll as for jelly roll; cut into 1/4 inch pieces; place with cut edges up on well-greased pan; sprinkle with a little sugar and cinnamon. Bake in moderate oven 30 to 35 minutes; remove from pan at once.

#### Parker House Rolls

4 cups flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
6 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder  
2 tablespoons shortening  
1 1/2 cups milk

Sift flour, salt and baking powder together. Add melted shortening to milk and add slowly to dry ingredients stirring until smooth. Knead lightly on floured board and roll out 1/2 inch thick. Cut with biscuit cutter. Crease each circle with back of knife one side of center. Butter the small section and fold larger part well over the small. Place one inch apart in greased pan. Allow to stand 15 minutes in warm place. Brush each with melted butter and bake in moderate oven 15 to 20 minutes.

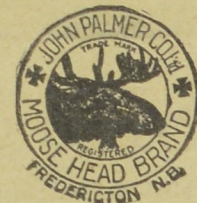
The Spanish medical group in Paris declare the "music cure" is infallible for all forms of encephalitis and sleeping gripe.

#### JAM CAKE.

Cream together one cup of sugar and three-fourths cup of butter; add three eggs, one cup jam (anything in cooked fruit will do, but apricots are perhaps the best) two cups of flour, three teaspoons of sour milk in which one heaping teaspoon of soda has been dissolved, cinnamon to taste, one cup of sour milk and one cup of raisins. Bake in slow oven until done.
