### NICE SUGAR COOKIES.

One cup of sugar, 1/2 cup butter, 3 ggs, whites and yolks beaten separately, 1 tablespoonful of milk, 1 teaspoonful of baking powder sifted into lour sufficient to make a dough to be rolled out.

Cream butter and sugar; beat in the whipped eggs; add the flour, a little at a time, stirring it in until dough s stiff enough to roll. Flour ands, make a ball of the dough and lay it on the molding board. Roll out n a sheet about 1/4 of an inch thick. Cut into cookies, sift granulated sugar oer each and bake a delicious brown in a quick oven.


