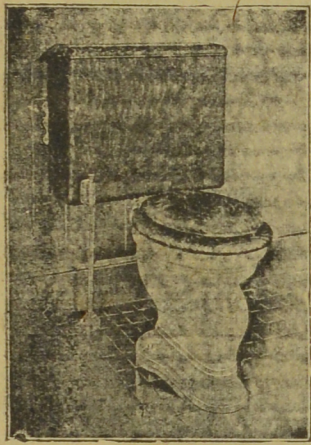

CROWN LANDS OF PROVINCE
ARE WELL ADMINISTERED

Under the Old Government the Lumbermen Were Compelled to Contribute to a Party Fund—The Foster Government Has Increased the Stumpage and Put the Money Into the Provincial Treasury.

OUR FOREST RESOURCES N ther administration of the crown lands is again to be handed over to those whose previous management disclosed a dishonest collection of the forest revenues and absolute lack of appreciation of the potential value of the asset in their keeping.

In view of the fact that conditions warranted an increase in the stumpage, and it was accordingly increased, what would be expected but considerable additional revenue? And this is described by the Globe as Foster government efficiency! Marvellous efficiency in very truth.

Although conditions warranted an increase in the stumpage in the days of the old government, there was no increase. Instead, the lumbermen were compelled by the government, under promise of immunity from a stumpage increase, to make large contributions which went, not into the provincial treasury, but into a party campaign fund, to be used in elections to keep that government in power. Some of the money may be available for the pending election. Whether it is or not, the fact remains as a proof of Foster government honesty and efficiency that it raised the stumpage and put the money where it belonged—in the public treasury; while the old government, instead of raising the stumpage, sold immunity to the lumbermen and put the price of its duplicity in a fund to debauch the electorate. It must be apparent to everyone that the forests of New Brunswick are the main source of provincial revenue and that on their wise, prudent and honest administration New Brunswick depends to keep down resorts to other and more exacting forms of taxation. In the current issue of Editor and Publisher, a New York trade journal, attention is directed to the value to Germany today of her well-conserved forests:

For fifty years Germany has been pointed to as one of the nations with a real government policy of forest conservation. The manner in which her forests were kept up prior to the war was one of the marvels to men of other nations interested in the subject. There is every indication now that those well-nursed forests are going to be Germany's trade salvation for the next twenty years. The world shortage of timber is so pronounced that we are going to beg, with other nations, for a chance to secure a share of what she has stored up during the years, while other nations, and especially this, wasted.

This month the first shipment of newsprint from Germany to the United States will reach New York. It will be followed quickly by other shipments. This single product of the forests is going to be used to establish a cotton-buying credit in the United States—the first step in trade resumption on a large scale.

The Foster government, under Hon. Dr. Smith's administration of the crown lands, inaugurated not only an honest collection of the stumpage, but took the first steps in the direction of a progressive policy aimed to make our forests play their full part in meeting provincial obligations. The election is a challenge to every voter to say whether that policy is to be pursued to its logical conclusion or whether

Notice to Stationary and Hoisting Engineers.

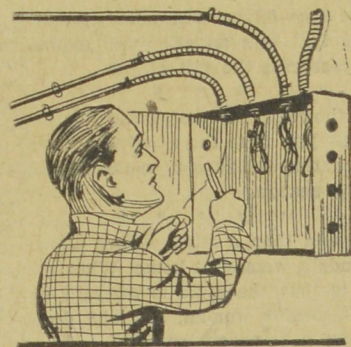
