DELICIOUS DESSERTS.

Almond Custard.

Put two cupfuls scalded milk in a double boiler, thicken with one and one-half tablespoonfuls cornstarch blended with water, boil three minutes. Add two beaten egg yolks and one-half cupful maple sirup, boil a few minutes more, and two-thirds cupful blanched, chopped almonds and one teaspoonful almond extract. Chill and serve with cream.

Macaroon Custard.

Make a custard of two cupfuls scalded milk, two eggs slightly beaten, one-third cupful corn sirup, a pinch of salt, one-half teaspoon almond extract and one cupful crushed macaroons. Bake same as plain custard. Chill and serve with or without whipped cream.

Caramel Pudding.

Stir one-third cupful brown sugar with one tablespoonful butter until it turns a light brown dissolve with one pint scalded milk, thicken with one and one-half tablespoonfuls cornstarch blended with water. Boil three minutes add one teaspoonful vanilla extract. Serve in sherbet cups, decorate with whipped cream and chopped nuts.

SAYS CHURCHES ARE ALL DEAD

New York, Sept. 29.—The Rev. John Haynes Holmes in a sermon on Sunday in the Community Church service held in the Lyric Theatre said churches are dead and must be abandoned in favor of a new type.

"All attempts to disguise the utter collapse of the churches have now become futile and ridiculous," said Dr. Holmes. "The churches all are alike, mere survivals of the past. The war marked the climax of a long period of moral and spiritual decay, which has now come to its completion in empty churches, discredited creeds and neglected rituals."

The preacher said religion still lives but that a new church must be evolved. He said the new church would be "un-denominational, democratic, free, universal—the spiritual embodiment of the common hopes and dreams of men."

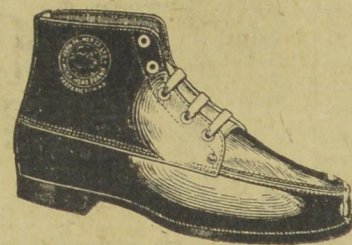

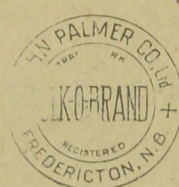
