None of his statements were denied. None of his statements could be denied because he quoted from sessional paper No. 147 in support of his remarks.

He showed that no interest on the loans had been paid. He showed that the goods thus sold to these bankrupt nations without adequate security would in all likelihood have reduced this high cost of similar goods to the people of Canada, if placed on the market of Canada.
