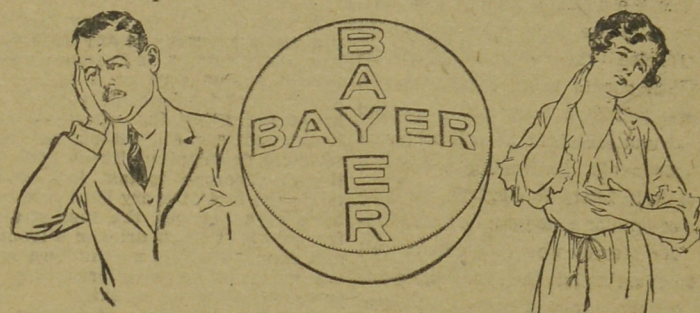
PLAUSIBLE ANSWER.

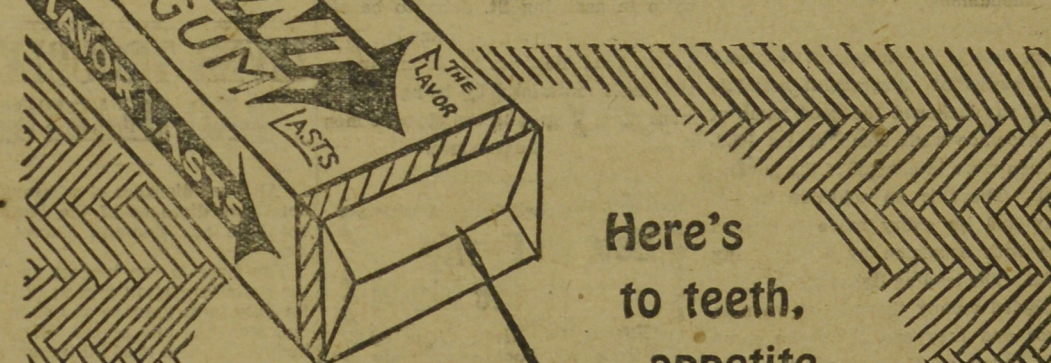
