McLELLAN CUP LIFTED BY TRURO TRURO CURLERS WEDNESDAY NIGHT—SCORE WAS 67 TO 57

Great Crowd of Spectators Watched the Play—R. FitzRandolph the Only Victorious Fredericton Skip—Local Curlers Led by Two Points on Afternoon Play—Banquet Followed the Match—An Enjoyable Affair.

The four challenging rinks of the Truro Curling Club lifted the McLellan Cup last night defeating the Fredericton curlers 67 to 57. The margin of ten points was not large for a four rink match but was sufficient.

The afternoon play ended with Fredericton leading by two points. Skip Robert FitzRandolph won by five points and was the only local skip to win. At night Truro got away and when play was within two or three

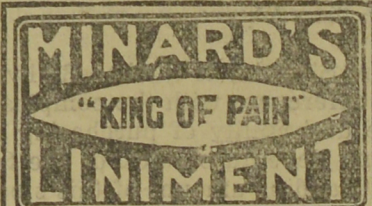

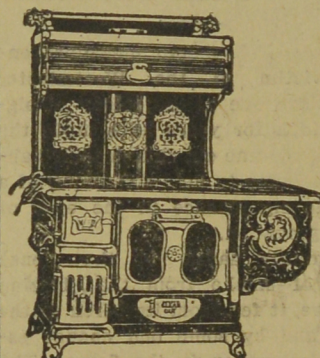

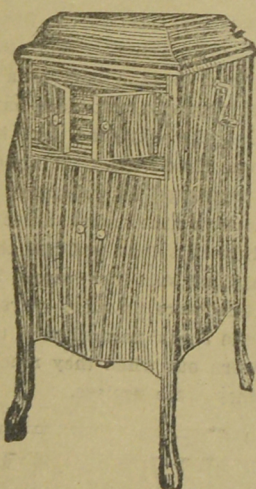

ENCOURAGE EXPLORATION

When addressing you last year, said the president of the Canadian Bank of Commerce at the annual meeting of the shareholders of that institution, I ventured to express the opinion that the Government could afford to grant a small bounty on the production of the gold mines in Canada, with a view to increasing the available supply of the precious metal. This opinion has met with disapproval in some quarters, but I still think that the Government should do something in the matter, perhaps not so much by way of offering a bounty on the gold itself, as to encourage the exploration and development of what are supposed to be gold-bearing areas. Were the same course to be followed in the case of silver, it is possible that the discovery of new fields and the opening of new mines might ex-

ercise a very beneficial steadying effect on the price of that metal. The extension of the output of the present mines is of course encouraged by the material enhancement in price which has taken place. According to figures made public some time ago, the price per ounce rose during last year from an average of \$10.11, during the first four months to \$12.72 in November.
