Nearly 200 men are out of work in consequence of the shut-down People who depend on wells for water supply for domestic purposes are com plaining of its scarcity.

May Bring Liquor in Luggage

Some of the police in this province interpret the federal liquor laws as permitting travelers from Quebec province to bring liquor into New Brunswick in suit cases or trunks for private use. Hitherto liquor so carried has been seized when found by officers or inspectors. Chief George Rideout, of Moncton, has informed this men that persons coming from Montreal can legally bring liquor in grips if intended for private use.
