A great many poultrymen who make a specialty of egg production, keep noth ing but pullets, disposing of the 1year-old hens before it is time to put them in winter quarters. The champion of the girls' poultry clubs of Mississippi keeps nothing but pullets.

Early hatched pullets if properly grown ought to begin laying in Octo lay through the winter. Yearling hens seldom begin laying much before cow every year over gravity skimming.
