3 WHITE SOX PLAYERS MAY BE DROPPED

Weaver, Risberg and Gandil Want More Money or Will Go Into Private Business.

Chicago, March 29—Three veteran members of the Chicago White Sox last year's American pennant winners may be dropped from baseball this season if they fail to report according to a statement issued today by Charles A. Comiskey, President of the club.

The three players named in the statement are George (Buck) Weaver, third baseman; Charles Risberg, shortstop, and "Chick" Gandil, first baseman.

Comiskey who returned from the Pacific coast declared that he had not seen any of the trio while there and had no reason to see them. Weaver and Risberg are under contract to play with his club season. Gandil has not signed his contract.

The players have threatened to go into business if their demands for higher salaries are granted, while President Comiskey is determined in his stand that the players live up to the contracts which were given them at their own request.

CHAMP WITH UPPER TEN

New York March 29—For the first time on American soil Georges Carpentier heavyweight boxing champion of Europe, has entered the pugilistic arena, and, needless to say, has captured a trophy of greater price than all the diamond-studded belts in creation. In two rounds, boxed last night with Major Anthony J. Drexler of Philadelphia, in the grand ball room of the Hotel Commodore, where the International Sporting Club gave a banquet to celebrate its register of 1,000 members the conqueror of Joe Beckett won the hearts of 2,000 guests, and he asked neither purse nor forfeit.

Not only the followers of the game but many distinguished guests were present, including ex-Governor Whitman; Major General John F. O'Ryan, who was toastmaster; Gaston Liebert, French Consul General in New York, who represented Ambassador Jules Jusserand and Gutson Borgium the sculptor.

SYNOTT WAS WITH TEAM

Pittsburg Pa. March 29—The Hamilton Tigers took the first game of its series with the Pittsburg Athletic Association team at Duquesne Gardens tonight by 4 to 3. The visitors owe their victory to their early start. They displayed speed that swept the locals off their feet in the first few minutes of play and had a three to one lead when the second period ended.

Pittsburg showed better team work in the final session and came within an ace of tying the score as the game ended.

The U. S. Olympic team evidently was used by Pittsburg as Frank Synott of Boston A. A. was used as a sub. Synott belonged originally to Chatham, N. B.

Pittsburg was composed of transplanted Canadians.

PLAYERS TO DIVIDE MONEY

The players' share in the receipts of the three first Stanley Cup games. The club owners get a division if four or more matches take place. The rinks take 30 per cent, of the gate, and the players divide, 60 per cent to the victors and 40 to the losers after all expenses are paid. The usual capacity gate at the Ottawa arena is \$3,500 but prices have been doubled for the Stanley Cup series.

No official figures have been given out but the rink has been crowded to the doors for both contests, so it can be safely said that there are about \$15,000 now waiting for division, with more in sight.


