

Enthusiastic Meetings



A ten per cent increase in passen ger rates to points in the United States went into effect on all the Canadian railroads yesterday. The increase applies to all through tickets except sleeping and parlor car rates.

The head tax on Canadians entering the United States was advanced to \$9.20 on account of the adverse exchange rate. The increase over the former tax of \$8 amounts to fifteen per cent.
