Bert Burgess and Bill Lounsbury of the U. N. B. squad will turn out with the High School to coach the players and give them the benefit of their experience.

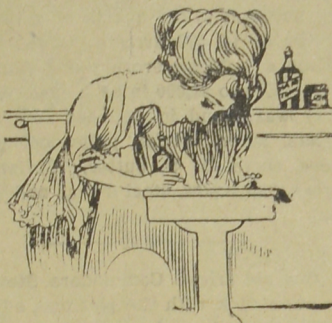
DRURY SAYS COMBINATION CANNOT LAST

Chatham, Ont., Dec. 4.—In a speech delivered here Friday night, Hon. E. C. Drury, Premier of Ontario, made the plain admission that the Farmers and the members of the Independent Labor party cannot continue as a U. F. O. Labor Government in this province. The perpetuation of the union, he said, is not in line with public opinion. The Farmers of Ontario, he declared, did not want class legislation or administration, but they did want a fair and honest administration of the affairs of the country in the interests of all of the people of the province.

"I am going to say something," he declared, "which I know will not be approved of by all of the members of the United Farmers of Ontario, but if we are to continue in office and fulfill our greatest mission as a government, the U. F. O. has got to branch out and broaden out. The old name of the party, if it continues in office will disappear of necessity and if I were choosing the new name to be adopted I would christen it not the Farmers' Party, but the People's Progressive Party, and take in everyone. Before long we will have to develop into a real peoples' party. The Farmers will still have representation in that party and they will stand for the ideals which they started out with when they went out to get power, but others will be represented as well, and the platform of that party will have to be one which the party desires to see carried out and not one to be used merely for the purpose of obtaining office.

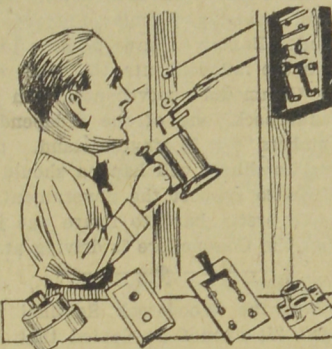

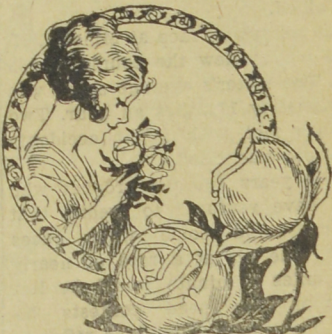

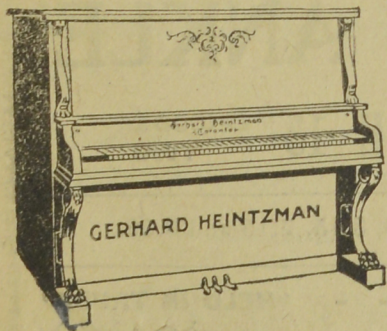
