Bring to the boiling point and let simmer 10 minutes then set aside over night. The following morning boil down until thick (skimming constantly while cook ing) and when cold cover with paraffin

PRESERVED BLACKBERRIES FOR PIES

Add one-third of currants (stemmed) o two-thirds raspberries. Crush the ook for 20 minutes. Then add threeourths the amount of sugar that you had of the combined fresh berries; let boil until thick, skimming when neessary. Cover down with paraffin

In 1913 men's wages in the lumber industry were \$28 to \$32 a month; in 1919, the were \$70 to \$85 a month (both being in addition to board and housing). ac cording to the New Brunswick Lum bermen's Association in accounting Write for full particulars at once, for the high cost of lumber.
