Half the babies born in Bombay die before reaching the age of eighteen months. In Delhi also the pathetic feature of the birthrate is the terrible wastage that occurs in the first year. One out of every four children born in 1919 was doomed to die within twelve months, and in 1918 one in every three died in the first year of its existence. 


