LIPTON YACHT EQUIPPED FOR LIGHT WINDS

Has Greater Sail Area Than
Either Resolute or Vanite—
Advantage for the
Challenger.

New York, May 17—Should light winds prevail off Sandy Hook during the America's Cup races the coming summer, Sir Thomas Lipton will have a very fair chance of lifting the trophy.

His latest Shamrock, the fourth of the line, is rigged for light weather. She carried a much greater area of sail than either the Vanite or the Resolute, which will fight it out soon for the honor of being the defending yacht.

In the past light winds have prevailed off Sandy Hook during the races for the America's Cup. If history repeats itself Sir Thomas may at last reach the goal of his heart's desire and bear the famous yachting trophy back home.

FLEMING TO GO AGAINST KILBANE

Toronto, May 17—Frankie Fleming's decision to box Johnny Kilbane for the world's featherweight crown here at the Grand Army carnival has proved welcome to the promoters and public alike. Of all those who aspire to win the title held during the past nine years by Kilbane none has a greater claim for recognition than the Canadian champion. Fleming has been waiting for a long time to get the title-holder in the ring, and it behooves him to make the best of this golden opportunity.

When Benny Leonard's quest of the lightweight championship's nearly came to an abrupt and several years ago in New York when he was inveigled into a match with no other boxer has since accomplished. Fleming has shown that when the occasion demands it he can hit, and hit hard.

The directors of the Grand Army carnival, realizing that Fleming was almost as much of an attraction as Kilbane, refused to take "no" for an answer, and after much negotiation Fleming attached his signature to the articles. He will get \$4,000 for his share win, lose or draw.

The match eclipses in importance the championship bout between Wallace and Wilde, but that is no guarantee that it will prove as interesting. Both bouts are titular affairs, and Queen City fans are fortunate that they will be able to see such sterling boxers in action.

One of the directors of the carnival left last night for New York, where he will make an offer to middleweight champion Wilson to defend his title here.

GUNBOAT SMITH WANTS LITTLE

Jack Johnson, who now is running a cafe at Tiajuana, says that he is going to defer his return to the United States until he has earned \$100,000 which he thinks, will be the sum required to fight his legal battle in the American Federal Courts.

Johnson still hopes to get some white heavyweight to box him, but so far he has met with scant success. When Tom Jones who is the matchmaker of the club at Tiajuana, asked Gunboat Smith if he would meet Johnson the Gunner wired in reply: "Will accept if you guarantee \$5,000 two round trip tickets, guarantee of 30 per cent, and deed to Tiajuana."

Mr. Johnson of New York was in the city last week.

M'CORMICK PRODUCES ALIBI FOR YANKEES

Manager Fellowes Made the
Goat—Accused of Parsimony in Handling
Hockey Team.

New York, May 17—Failure of the American Olympic hockey team to defeat the Canadians for first place at Antwerp is alleied by Capt. Joseph McCormick, leader of the team, to have been due in a measure to Cornelius Fellowes, manager of the team. The team arrived home on the American liner Mongolia.

McCormick stated that Fellowes treated them badly forcing the members of the team to live in a third-class hotel in Antwerp while he himself stopped at a good hostelry. When the ordinary drinking water found in Belgium did not agree with them, the members of the team wished to drink bottled water, but this was refused them by Fellowes, McCormick stated.

When they applied for bicycles with which to keep their limbs in condition for the contests, the manager refused them this also, said the team captain Capt. McCormick said that the succession of acts by the manager destroyed the morale of the team and injured its playing ability in the crucial contests. He said that his complaint would be presented to the New York Athletic Club.

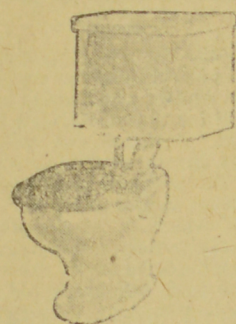
PRO. LACROSSE GOES BY BOARD

Ottawa, May 17—A unanimous decision to operate on a strictly amateur basis was reached at the postponed annual meeting of the Ottawa Lacrosse Club. As a result the Ottawa Club will forward its resignation to the National Lacrosse Union, Sec'y Ernie Butterworth being instructed to that effect. Frank Hearn, who interviewed Secretary R. E. Melville of the Quebec branch of the A. A. U. of C. early in the week regarding the possibility of being allowed to mix professionals and amateurs, with the sanction of the governing board, reported to the members the result of his mission. It was to the effect that the Quebec authorities would not countenance the mingling of the amateurs and the pros.

The work of organizing an amateur league with M. A. A. A. and a second Montreal club will be continued and definite plans announced shortly.
