New York, Seb. 14-One of the peculiar angles about the use of Canad ian money at the box offices of three local theatres developed during the lunch hour at the Longacre Theatre At a quarter after 12 a gentleman, who introduced himself as a resident of Toronto asked for two orchestra 'seats for "Adam and Eve" and gave in return a \$20 Canadian bill. The Treasurer, without thinking of the financial problem involved gave him his tickets and \$14.50 in American money
