## Y. M. C. A. TOOK FIRST GAME OF THE CITY CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES FROM IMPERIALS LAST EVENING

**Winners Batted Hard and the Score was 3 to 0—Wheeler was Pitcher for the Y. M. C. A. Team—Wright in the Box for the Imperials—Interesting Games Expected in This Late Summer Series.**

Y. M. C. A. York County League Champions, took a grip on the City Championship series last evening beating the Imperials 3 to 0. Only five innings were played. It was supposed to start at 6.15 but did not get going till long afterward. A small crowd of spectators which turned out did not take kindly to the delay. Y. M. C. A. was responsible for it as the Imps had their players ready.

Y. M. C. A. deserved to win although Imperials worked better in the field. Wright pitched for the losers and the Y team batted him hard. The Imperials' errors also came at a time when they meant runs. Wheeler was in the box for the Y team and the Imp batters failed to solve his delivery. But one hit was made off him. In the last inning he struck out three men.

### Changes in Teams.

The teams were braced up for the series. Hall who was with Fredericton City was at third for the Imperials and looked well on that corner. Y. M. C. A. again had Burke late of Marysville and "Bill" Bolster late of Devon. Bill Kenney who pitched for Fredericton City appeared in the outfield. Davis at third and Burke at Shortstop made that side of the infield look the best it has this year.

Y. M. C. A. started out with two singles off Wright. The Imps right up and nobody scored. Kierstead tried to but Wright fielded him out at the plate. For the Imps Robinson hammered out a single and things looked rosy. However it was their sole hit. Only in the second inning did they look like scoring but although George Wandless reached third base he stayed there, the Y. M. C. A. infield taking care of the rest of the batters.

Y. M. C. A. got going in the third. With one down Jack Bolster singled. Donovan drove the ball into the Grandstand for two bases scoring Bolster. In the fifth Y. M. C. A. added two more. It came near being three as Burke was hit by pitcher and went to third on Jack Bolster's hit. Lifford who fielded sharply all through the game threw him out at the plate. Bolster went to second on an error by Harrison and to third when Burke went out. Kierstead cleared the bases with a single. That ended the scoring.

## THESE TWO GOT ACQUAINTED WHEN BLOWN UP

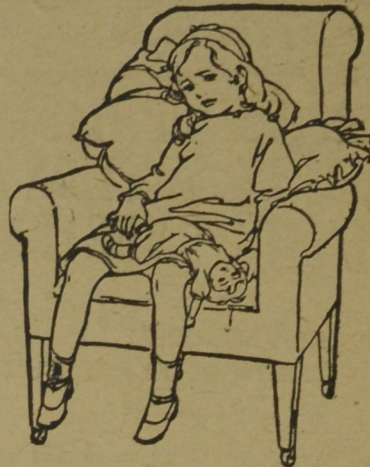
Topeka, Kan., Aug. 16—Among the queer freaks of fate as recorded of the late war stands the case of the two youths who lived in Hutchinson and worked for the same employer. Despite this they were unacquainted until on January 23, 1918, twenty-five miles off the Irish coast the transport Tuscania was torpedoed. Among those thrown in the water was John Kumorofsky, a Pole, and Clarence Bates, both formerly employed at the Bisonte Hotel in Hutchinson.

Bates was rescued by the English destroyer Mosquito and taken to Londonderry, from where he was sent to a rest camp at Winchester. He later saw extensive service with the 117th Ammunition Train of the famous Rainbow Division.

Kumorofsky was sent to the front near Leon and after the armistice was sent with his outfit to Paris and then to Brest.

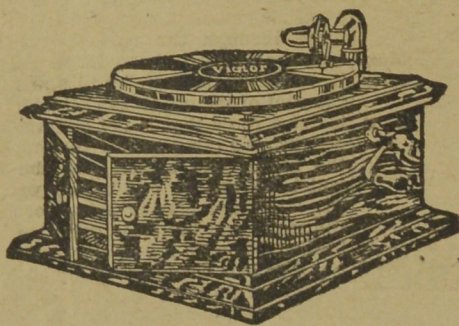
