Upon or dinary issues even Bonar Law, with his Scotch shrewdness, pawky humo an ddirectness of attack, will often succeed where the Prime Minister arouses only suspicion and anger. But upon great occasions with his back to the wall Lloyd George is a sight for Gods and men.

A good many years ago I used to attend regularly the sittings of the London County Council in the early days when the Progressive party waghe is now, an intimate personal friend One day Burns called me down to introduce me to a distinguished American visitor in the person of William Jennings Bryan.
