WAYS WITH TOMATOES

Cold Tomato Entree

Cut off top of firm ripe tomato; remove seeds carefully, stuff with a mixture of chopped anchovies, olives, water cress and yolks of hard boiled eggs

Yellow Tomatoes

Yellow tomatoes will soon be in the market. They are peeled and used whole, arranged on white lettuce leaves. Serve with mayonnaise or French dressing. Sprinkle with chopped green peppers.

Sardine Tomatoes

Peel, chill and cut in cubes firm, ripe tomatoes; arrange on crisp lettuce leaves. Skin and chop several small boneless sardines, whip into a thin mayonnaise and serve.

Tomato Toast

Concentrated tomatoe soup (undiluted) with a bit of butter added and poured over zwieback moistened with hot milk or water makes a tasty luncheon dish.

BAKING POWDER NUT BREAD

Two cups white flour, 2 cups graham and rye flour mixed, 2 teaspoons salt. Sift the above three times, add 4 teaspoons baking powder and sift once more. In a pan beat hard 1 egg, add $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar, 1 cup milk and 1 cup of warm water; add 1 large cup chopped walnut meats to the flour, and put all together; stir fast and put in greased bread pans; bake in a moderate oven about $\frac{1}{2}$ hour.

THREE-MINUTE CAKE

Two eggs, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk, 1-13 cups brown sugar, 1-3 cup butter, 14 cups flour, 3 teaspoons baking powder, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon cinnamon, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon grated nutmeg, $\frac{1}{2}$ pound stoned dates, cut in pieces.

Put all the ingredients together and beat them 3 minutes. Bake from 35 to 40 minutes in a loaf.

Be sure to put all ingredients in together; adding them separately will cause failure.

VEGETABLE CUTLETS

Boil 6 large potatoes, mash them, add butter, seasoning and enough hot milk to moisten. Chop fine 3 button onions, fry in butter to light brown. Wash, peel and scrape, and boil separately 12 small carrots and 4 small white turnips. Chop and add with the onions to the potato. Season to taste, add a little minced parsley and cool. Mold into small cutlets, dip in beaten egg, then powdered cracker crumbs. Fry to a golden brown in boiling fat.

STEAMED FIG PUDDING

One cup chopped figs, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped suet, 3 eggs, $2\frac{1}{4}$ cups soft bread crumbs, 1-3 cup milk, 1 cup sugar, teaspoon salt.

Cover bread crumbs with milk; chop figs and suet together; add all other ingredients and pour in buttered mold. Steam 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Serve with heavy cream.

CATTLE PLAGUE IS RAGING NOW IN BELGIUM

Paris, Sept. 18.—What French cattle men fear may develop into a most serious epidemic of what they call "cattle plague," has broken out in Belgium, and one or two cases has been reported from the French side of the frontier. The Ministry of Agriculture has issued the strictest quarantine regulations against the importation of Belgian cattle to France, but despite this action French farmers are gravely apprehensive of the spread of the epidemic which would cause almost irreparable catastrophe to the farms of the devastated regions which now are just beginning to get back to normal or nearly normal productivity.

"At the present time," said M. Ricard, Minister of Agriculture, "there are but one or two cases of the plague reported in France. But it is raging at Courtaut or less than eight kilometers from our frontier."

M. Ricard left Paris today for Brussels where he will confer with the Belgian authorities on measures to check the epidemic.

It had not been heard of in France since 1871 until it suddenly appeared three weeks ago to Antwerp. A herd of zebus shipped from India to Rio Janeiro were turned into the cattle pens at Antwerp where they touched en route. A large number of them died during the transfer but no importance was attached to the malady from which they suffered. Later on several hundred head of cattle were turned into the pens which the zebus had occupied and it was among this consignment of cattle that the plague first showed. Scores of the animals succumbed to it.

The excretions are virulent and this explains the contagiousness of the disease. To check the spread of it the contaminated region must be isolated. But this is impossible, for even birds can and do carry the germ. A flock of birds, coming from the infected region of Belgium, could spread the disease throughout the Northern French Departments.

A serum, it is said, has been used with success against the disease in Egypt, India and South Africa. But there is none of the serum available in France.

The danger can only be passed, the farmers of Northern France are being told by the government, by killing an infected animal the moment the first symptom of the plague appears. It is probably that the first step taken by the French and Belgium governments to combat the spread of the disease will be to exercise a stricter surveillance as it is called, is a war disease. 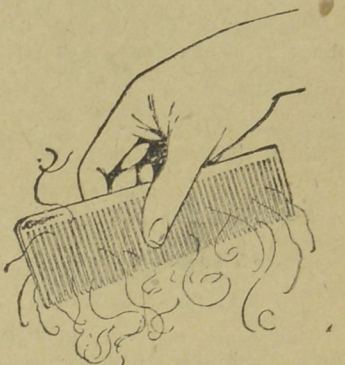

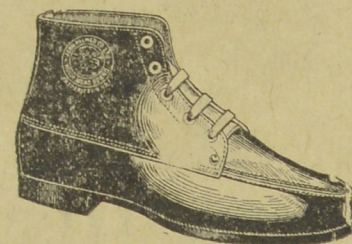

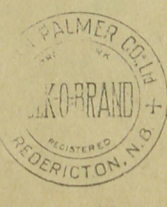
