

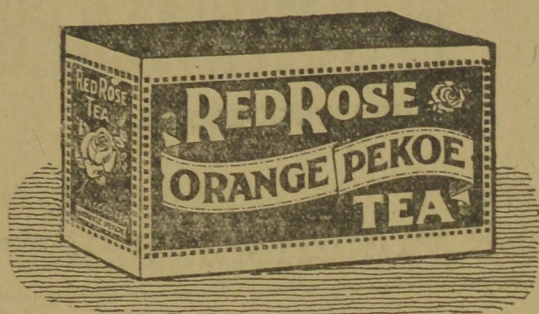

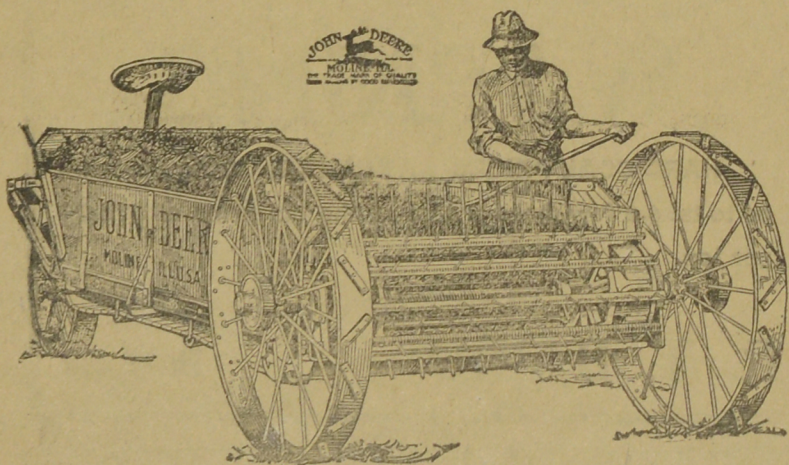

CARPENTIER IN AMERICA WITH BRIDE

New York, April 4—Georges Carpentier is here, France's greatest ring warrior and a war hero who was twice wounded and thrice decorated for bravery in action arrived in New York at 10 o'clock this afternoon when the French liner Savoie docked at Pier 15.

The noted pugilist was accompanied by his bride of three weeks and Francois Descamps, his manager. He is here to reap a harvest of American dollars and perhaps to capture the world's heavyweight championship now held by Jack Dempsey.

A swarm of reporters, photographers and various persons more or less interested in the numerous contracts Manager Descamps has signed boarded the Savoie with the customs officers at Quarantine. There was a few minutes of searching for the pugilist and then he was found and escorted to the bow of the ship on the upper deck, where an enclosure had been roped off to keep away the curious passengers so that the photographers could do their work.

For twenty minutes Carpentier, his bride and his manager faced the battery of cameras. He permitted himself to be pulled here and there and to be made to assume various poses with the utmost good nature, all the time wearing a broad smile. It is easy to see why Europe is so enthusiastic over this idol of the ring and fashion plate of the boulevards.

Looks Like an Actor

The Frenchman bears no marks of his calling. His clean cut features are unblemished by the slightest scar for all his many battles in the ring. He is blond, brushes his hair straight back from his forehead and dresses in the height of fashion. He was arrayed in a neat blue suit and gray felt hat and carried a cane. Altogether he looked far more like an actor than a fighter.

In the buttonhole of his coat lapel Carpentier wore the ribbon indicating that he was the holder of the Croix de Guerre with six stars, and also the ribbon of the Medaille Militaire, which the plucky French boxer won on the fighting line as a sergeant in the French aviation service. In his war service he was wounded by shrapnel twice, once in the right foot and once in the head.

Mme. Carpentier looked rather horrified when it was suggested that she might witness a championship bout between her husband and Dempsey. "No, No," she replied in French, "I shall never see him when he makes the big fight. In the practice I shall see him." She denied that she had demanded that her husband retire after his next fight.

Carpentier weighs about 175 pounds now and his fighting weight is slightly under 170. With memories of Dempsey fresh in mind, he certainly looks rather slight and frail for the task of meeting the heavyweight champion. But the fact that he is a crack athlete with abundance of speed can be seen at a glance in the way he carries himself.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Under Sub-Section 2 of Section 73 of the Highway Act 1914 no motor vehicle is allowed on any highway of the Province in the Spring of the year while the frost is coming out of the ground, without permission of the Supervisor, with the exception of physicians, clergymen and ambulance drivers. Sub-section 1 of the same section of the Act forbids the carrying of loads over 3000 pounds and the hauling of portable mills on wheels between the fifteenth day of March and the fifteenth day of May, in any year, without a written permit from the Supervisor of Roads. This notice will remain in force until the Supervisor is satisfied that the road is fit for motor traffic, as applied to sub-section 2, and until arrangements be made with the Supervisor in compliance with the Act, as applied to sub-section 1.

Brebner, of Cabano, Quebec, Manager, and Thomas Matheson, of Estcourt, Quebec, Manager, for the passage of an Act incorporating the applicants and such other persons as

may become associated with them, with power to erect, construct, maintain and operate a dam at or near the Tobique Narrows, in the Parish of Perth, in the County of Victoria, for the purpose of generating, developing, selling, distributing, using and disposing of hydro-electric power, and with power to erect, construct, maintain and operate pulp and paper mills and other manufacturing, and with power to expropriate real property at the site of the proposed dam and for sewage and other rights and with all the usual powers incident to a corporation, including the power to issue bonds, debentures, debenture stock and share warrants.
