THE BOSTON NATIONALS START SOUTH

Eibel Again to be With the Red Sox—Hickey Has Been Returned to Portsmouth, Va.

Boston, Feb. 29.—Ford, the Tufts infielder who was with the Boston Braves last fall and who was undecided as to whether he would continue in baseball, came to terms and will be one of the party which is to start for the South this week.

Manager Stallings will have a squad of 32 men to put to work at Columbus next Wednesday among whom will be nine candidates for the outfield positions and six catchers, most of whom are promising youngsters. If two or three of these should come through it would make a vast difference in the prospects of the Braves.

Maranville Confident

There is a lot of luck in baseball and possibly some of it may fall Grant's way this year. It certainly broke against him last season which, with having a weak team, made the Braves look rather weak. They got away to a very poor start. Neither Maranville nor Gowdy played up to their best form, being handicapped through the loss of Spring practice. Both these veterans will do better work this year.

Maranville says the coming season is going to be the best of his career, and he honestly believes he will hit for pretty near .300.

Red Sox Outlook

It was announced at Red Sox headquarters that "Hack" Eibel has again been taken on by the Boston American League Club and will be given a tryout at Hot Springs by Manager Barrow.

Eibel was with the Red Sox two years ago, but suffered a sprained ankle and later was let out. He believes he can impress the Boston management if given an opportunity.

Harry Hickey of Albany who looks like a promising left-hand pitcher was turned back by the Boston club to the Portsmouth club of the Virginia League for further seasoning.

Evidently the major leagues propose to make an example of some players who have made a practice of betting on the results of ball games in which they participate even if they had bet on their own team to win. The idea seems to be to discourage gambling on the games in every way possible, and especially to prevent any association whatever between the players and gamblers.

MURPHY AFTER BIG DAMAGES

Chicago, Feb. 29.—Hearing on the application for an injunction against the heads of the National Baseball League, brought by Charles W. Murphy former baseball magnate was postponed until March 8 by Judge George F. Barrett of the Circuit Court. The injunction petition asks that members of the National League be restrained and enjoined from scheduling or formulating any plans for a baseball circuit for the 1920 season. Murphy alleges that \$121,922 is due him for rental fees from 1914 until 1919. The claim is based upon the lease or contract for the use of the old National League park on the West Side. Murphy alleges that the league broke its contract with him when it moved its home to the old Federal League grounds.

Murphy's attorneys said a continuance by agreement with the attorneys for the defendants had been arranged.

SASKATCHEWAN HAS ASKED FOR A PLEBISCITE

Regina, Sask., Feb. 28.—Indications point to the likelihood of the prohibition plebiscite being taken in this province about the last week in April or the first week in May, provided the Federal government adheres strictly to the provisions of the Canada Temperance Act and provided there is no vital amendment to the Act in this respect at the present session of the Dominion House.

The C. T. A. provides that the Federal government shall conduct a plebiscite upon the request of any province within three months from the date of the receipt of a resolution containing such request from a provincial assembly. Such a resolution, prepared and signed by G. A. Mantle, clerk of the Legislative Assembly, was sent to Ottawa on February 4th.


