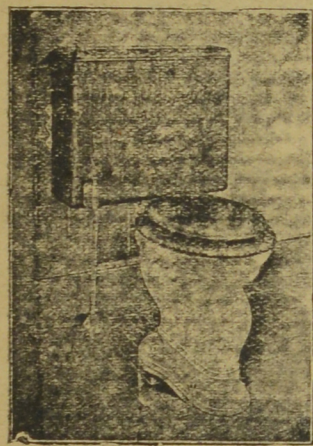

VIENNA PROFESSOR CAN
MAKE OLD PEOPLE YOUNG

Claims to Have Discovered the Fountain of Youth—Revival of the Germ Glands Made Possible by a Simple Operation—Began Experimenting on Rats Ten Years Ago and Succeeded in Renewing Their Youth.

London, Sept. 1st.—Ponce de Leon was a fine old man with a fine old idea. But alas! he is gone and his idea remains only an idea. The Fountain of Youth is pointed out in several places at St. Augustine, Florida, but so far all the fountains together have failed to make one old man young. Every little while a modern Ponce de Leon rises up and offers to restore to us youth and beauty after old Father Time has been scratching at our faces for so many years that the marks have sunk deep. The latest man to offer the one best boon to humanity, the Vienna University Professor Dr. Eugen Steinbach, has just disclosed some remarkable particulars with regard to his discoveries in the direction of making old people young again.

He is a typical scientist, with a long grey beard, sharp features, and energetic eyes, and looks keen and clever enough to have discovered anything. So let us hope he has found out how we can be forever young and lovely.

The revival of the germ glands that supply us with youth is he claims, made possible by a simple operation, while a similar result can be obtained by the repeated application of the Rontgen Ray and X Ray.

Dr. Steinbach states that he began experimenting on a rat ten years ago. After two years he discovered that senile rats showed renewed youth within four weeks after an operation on the germ gland or treatment with X rays. He now has a big collection of photographs of rats before and after the operation. Senile animals after being treated, carried their heads high and became regular gay Lotharios. Their eyes were bright again, and their fur coats thick and woolly. Descendants of the rejuvenated animals developed splendidly.

Dr. Steinbach performed operations on three men on occasions when they were receiving surgical treatment for some other reason. He kept the fact of his having also performed this special youth-renewing operation a secret and the patients were and still are perfectly unaware of what happened to them. The three experiments were successful, and after two months the patients regained their vital energy, but to this day they have no idea why they again feel so cheery.

Youth Renewed

He has a letter from a seventy-one year old man, who says: "I am feeling rejuvenated in every way; my hair and nails are growing quicker than before my appetite is similar to that of a thirty year old man, and my general appearance is like that of a man in the fifties. The trembling of my hands has disappeared entirely."

Women treated with X rays showed similar results. It is now suggested that Ninon de l'Enclos, the famous French beauty of the 17th century, who was in her hey-day as a fascinator when she was over seventy must have had this germ gland renewal secret and let it die with her at the ripe old age of ninety two; for the Professor says that the lifetime of the animals he experimented upon was in every case prolonged by one-fourth, and they retained their vigor to the end. He also says that his funds for further experiments are exhausted, and that he is now only making his discovery public in order that rich philanthropists may step forward and assist him. Queen Elizabeth slipped away 317 years too soon. Her last words were "Millions of money for a

moment of Time!" And if Dr. Steinbach had been on hand that would have been her opportunity—and his.

SOME NOTES
OF INTEREST
TO MOTORISTS

Automobiles are used in the cattle rustling business in Western Canada.

A speedy revival of the automobile industry is predicted in Vienna, Austria.

The average wage in the automobile industry in New York State is \$30.25 a week.

Motorists are arrested in Philadelphia for excessive sounding of signal devices on motor cars.

During the first five months of 1920 the consumption of gasoline increased 26 per cent over last year.

The State College at Amer, Ia., offers a two weeks' course on tractor operation for the sons of farmers.

St. Louis, Mo., produces more motor vehicles of \$4,000-4b. capacity than any other city in the United States.

Massachusetts is 206,094 passenger automobiles, or 26 per cent ahead of the registration for corresponding time last year.

Recent tests of motor fuel just completed by the Bureau of Mines shows San Francisco getting the best summer gasoline.

As a means of quick delivery, the Great Lakes freighters are remodelled to carry automobiles from Detroit and Cleveland to other lake ports.

A good roads' association was recently formed by a large number of prominent Argentine, American and British business men of Buenos Aires.

Twenty years ago an electric vehicle company issued a catalogue showing seventeen different styles of electric vehicles, but only one gasoline car.

Of the more than one million motor trucks in use in the United States, New York leads all others with a total of 97,716. Illinois is second and Ohio third.

Parisian taxicab drivers, afraid of being assassinated in the deserted streets at nightfall, have asked the Prefecture of Police for permission to carry revolvers.

The Jefferson-Highway is 1,600 miles long, extending from Winnipeg, Canada, through St. Paul, Des Moines, Kansas City and Joplin to New Orleans.

Senator Boise Penrose received motor license number 500,000, the highest to be awarded this year by the Pennsylvania State Highway Department.

Ralph de Palma, the automobile racer, was naturalized recently by the Federal Court, in Brooklyn, N. Y. De Palma came to this country from Italy when ten years old.

In the Pacific Coast States there were 239,000 motor vehicles and 3,000 tractors five years ago, whereas today there are 780,000 motor vehicles and 250,000 tractors.

It is estimated that the number of new motor cars which will be built and sold this year will be 2,250,000, while the number that will be retired from service will be 1,525,000.

In a recent check of different State licenses on passenger automobiles entering Canada, twenty States, representing cars from Florida to Washington, were counted in a single day.

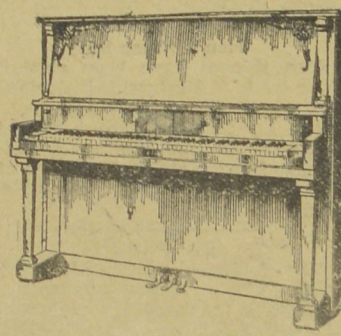
