HOW NEW BRUNSWICK HAS
BEEN LIFTED OUT OF THE MIRE

Flattering Tributes to the Foster Government by the Outside Press Contrasted With Scathing Criticism Which the Old Government Brought Down Upon Its Head by Its Gross Violation of a Solemn Public Trust—Something for Intelligent Electors of York to Read and Digest.

LOOK ON THIS

The Toronto Globe, one of the most influential newspapers in Canada, says concerning the dissolution of the New Brunswick Legislature:

"Premier Foster's manifesto deals with other essentially provincial projects to which the administration is committed, and outlines in moderate language and straightforward fashion the record of his government. Canadians will recall the extraordinary circumstances under which this young man was called from commercial business into public life. He candidly says that he found himself 'entirely unused to political life,' but he has striven to give the people of New Brunswick businesslike and progressive government. When he and his associates took office after the last general election, they found confusion and disorganization, and their first work was to clear away the wreckage and present to the people the real state of affairs. The dark story was told by sworn testimony taken by royal commissions, and the succession of exposures startled the province.

"The regime of the Foster government has been vastly different from that of its predecessor. It has been clean, honest, diligent, efficient, enterprising and progressive. In a period of world and national stress New Brunswick has been enabled to move forward. Its administration for the past few years has striven earnestly to guard the public interests and meet the public needs. Premier Foster has earned the vote of confidence which doubtless will be accorded him by his fellow-citizens at the coming general election."

A Nova Scotia View.

Another tribute comes from Nova Scotia, where the Murray government so recently carried all before it. The Halifax Chronicle refers editorially to the shocking conditions existing in New Brunswick before the present government came into power, and says: "Under the able and energetic leadership of Hon. W. E. Foster, the reputation of New Brunswick has been restored, public confidence has been re-established, and the prestige of the province has been enhanced at home and abroad.

"New Brunswick has done well under the administration of its present government. Its prime minister, Hon. Mr. Foster, did not seek the office. He responded to the call after the last general election, largely as a matter of public duty, and although he entered upon his responsible task without experience in public life, we believe it is the general testimony that he has done more than well. He has not been showy or spectacular in his methods, but he has measured up admirably to the responsibilities of his position as a straightforward, public-spirited and competent leader, who is jealous of the good name and honor of his province, and is eager to promote its interests by sane and enterprising administration of its public affairs. Premier Foster has proved himself a worthy leader in the new era of public life in New Brunswick, and it is unthinkable that the electors of that province will fail to give a handsome verdict of approval of his government's record of well-doing."

Commenting on the report of the royal commission which investigated the Dugal charges in 1914, the Quebec Chronicle, a leading Conservative paper, then said:

"The terrible revelations of official graft in New Brunswick are a disgrace not only to that province, but to all Canada. They almost completely destroy public confidence in the honesty of our public men, and unquestionably inspire grave doubts as to the possibility of ever securing anything like an upright administration of public affairs under our present system. Yet no administration ever came into office with more pious professions of high virtue and devotion to the public weal than did the Flemming government of New Brunswick. On the strength of these it literally swept the Province at the last general election in 1912, only two members being returned to support the Opposition.

"There is no longer the shadow of a doubt that loot was the object for which the men now in charge of the government of the sister province down by the sea sought office. Their conduct of public affairs was dishonest from the start, and today, under their manipulation, no province in Canada has been so betrayed, so shamed and so degraded as New Brunswick by these same men who have played in the most heartless manner upon the good faith, the loyalty and the patriotism of their people in order that they might scatter the contents of the treasury among themselves and their heelers?"

Was Thoroughly Discredited.

Discussing the dissolution of the New Brunswick Legislature, in February, 1917, the Halifax Chronicle said:

"The reorganization of the New Brunswick government, by which the Hon. Mr. Clarke has retired from and Hon. J. A. Murray has been promoted to the Premiership, has been followed by a dissolution of the Legislature, and the calling of a general election. Nominations will be made on February 17th, polling will take place on February 24th. The New Brunswick Government is thoroughly discredited as the result of scandals which forced Hon. J. K. Flemming out of the Premiership, yet the new Premier is still linking his fortunes with Mr. Flemming. The announcement is made in the government press that Mr. Murray begins his campaign by placing ex-Premier Flemming in the forefront of the battle as a spokesman of the Government."

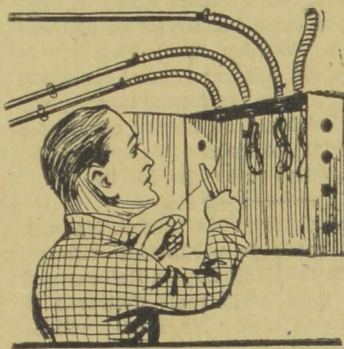
