KEEPING BABY COMFORTABLE.



London, Dec. 19-Father O'Flanagan has been in correspondence with the British prime minister regarding a truce in Ireland has replied to Mr. Lloyd George's latest message in which the prime minister regretted that the door had been closed, "to invoked at the beginning of this correspondence."

In his rejoinder Father O'Flanagan says that reconciliation is only possible when accredited representatives

of "both nations meet as equals." Premier Lloyd George had written previously: "I had hoped that with moderation and common sense on censorship that will occrespond to the both sides it might have been possible to reach an understanding which would put a stop to strife in Ireland and pave the way to a reconciliation. You now imply in your judgment the only road to peace is the recognition of an Irish republic and the negotiation of a treaty with some one you designate as the official head and president of that republic.

"I have never failed to make it clear that there is no possibility of a settlement so long as the Sinn Fein demands an Irish republic."
