HARDWOOD MEN PLANNED FOR HIGHER PRICES

Memphis, Tenn., March 18—The more than 300 members of the American Hardwood Manufacturers' Association were restrained from further exchange and distribution of stock and sales statements and certain other trade reports by an injunction granted here by Federal Judge McCall.

The injunction will remain in force pending final hearing of the Government's complaint against the "open competition plan" which was filed Feb. 14.

"It is difficult if not impossible on this record," Judge McCall said, "to escape the conclusion that the purpose and intention of the plan was to suppress competition among its members and create and perpetuate a condition in the hardwood lumber manufacturing business wherein the production of hardwood lumber was to be kept low enough to maintain prices on an ascending scale but not so low as to drive prices to such heights under the stimulating influence produced by the propaganda to 'build now,' that consumers would be induced to use substitutes."

PUBLIC MAN OF NOVA SCOTIA PASSES AWAY

Halifax, March 20—Hon. Samuel Walter Willett Pickup, member of the Legislative Council, ex-member of the Federal Parliament, and for thirty-five years prominent in the political life of Annapolis County, died at his residence at Granville Ferry this week after a very brief illness. His death was unexpected. Mr. Pickup was present at the opening of the Legislature, and returned to his home in Granville Ferry on Saturday morning. He had not been in good health for some time, but there was no indication that his condition was serious. He became ill on Monday night and passed away at 4.30 yesterday afternoon.

The deceased for a number of years represented Annapolis in the House of Commons as a Liberal and at the time of his death was a member of the legislative council.

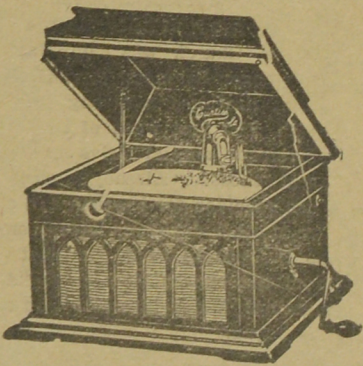
