

Ald. Camp claimed that seventyfive cents was too small a fare to the eastern city line. He also objected to half-fare for children under twelve years. It would be all right to drive children under five years for nothing. He argued that the drivers of motor vehicles could not profitably make a trip to the Experimental Farm for sev enty-five cents.

Ald. Young suggested seventy-five cents be the fare to the Wilsey Road and to points below that discretionary with the driver.

Ald. Camp said it was putting coach driving on a low basis when those in the business were taxed and licensed and then held down to cheap prices. Difference of Opinion

Mayor Hanson-"Within the city the charge of fifty cents is not cherr." Ald. Cooper said that in view of U e opposition, he would withdraw his motion to re-enter it next month. In the meantime record might be kept of the violations by hack drivers.

Ald. Young as seconder refised to withdraw the motion. A satisfactory bylaw could be drafted.

Discussion ensued. Mayor Hanson said that on the night of the big storm Ald. Reid, Ald. Davidson and himself had been turned down by a hack-driver in front of the City Hall, the man saying he was going to get his supper and would drive no person. That showed how independent these drivers were

The motion was carried. Ald. Camp said he would give notice of recon sideration for the next meeting. Mayor Hanson said that he could not do that as he had voted against the motion.
